WIN-THE-WAR RECIPES.

These recipes are issued by the Fredericton Food Control Committee.

Brown Pudding.

2 cups cooked oatmeal.
½ cup molasses.
½ cup raisins.
1 tablespoon butter or butter substitute.
½ teaspoon cinnamon.
Mix all ingredients together and bake half an hour. Serve hot or cold.

War Piecrust.

1 cup flour.
¼ cup fine oatmeal.
1 tablespoon lard or bacon fat.
1 tablespoon butter.
1 teaspoon baking powder.
Pinch of salt.
Chop all together or rub together with the tips of the fingers. Moisten to a dough with very cold water and roll.
