

MR. BAXTER'S CHARGES AGAINST SPEAKER CURRIE

Sensation Sprung in the Legislature by the Ex-Attorney General---Claims that an Attempt Was Made to Unduly Influence a Lumber Scaler in Restigouche---An Emphatic Denial Given to the Charges in the Form of Affidavits.

Serious charges against Hon. William Currie, Speaker of the Legislature, laid by Mr. J. B. M. Baxter, shortly before the House adjourned last night were met with prompt and explicit denials by Mr. Currie in an affidavit read by Premier Foster, and in another affidavit by Daniel E. Richards, with whom Mr. Currie is associated in the lumber company whose operations give rise to the charges. The charges were made by Mr. Baxter in giving notice of motion

for Thursday next when he will move for the appointment of a committee of the House to investigate them. The premier assured the hon. members that such a request would be granted and the fullest investigation would be made as promptly as possible.

It was at the close of the third sitting of a long day, as the hands of the clock were nearly at twelve that Mr. Baxter arose and announced that he wished to give notice of motion involving serious charges against a member of the House. He then read an affidavit signed by Archibald Murchie, a former government lumber scaler, in which Murchie declared that he had reduced his report on which stumpage is paid, for the operations of the Continental Lumber Company of Charlott, Restigouche county, of which Hon. Mr. Currie is manager, by an amount of more than 2,000,000 feet, at Mr. Currie's request. Mr.

The Charges.

In his affidavit Mr. Murchie swears that he was appointed in 1908 by the government as lumber scaler of all lumber cut on crown lands along all streams flowing into the Bay Chaleur in district No. 5, county of Restigouche, and acted as such until the summer of 1917. While so acting it was his duty to scale the lumber cut by the different operators along the said rivers on crown lands and make a yearly report of each season's cut to the government, on which report the stumpage accounts were rendered.

That a crown lumber cut during the logging season of 1916 and 1917 by the Continental Lumber Company, Ltd., of Charlott, Restigouche county, of which Hon. William Currie is manager, was cut in the district over which he had been acting as surveyor, that all such lumber was scaled and counted by himself and his counters and the report of the scale and count was made by him about April 1, 1917, to be forwarded to the government.

That a copy annexed was an exact copy of the report so prepared;

That upon the completion of the report he in company with Joseph LaPointe, went to the office of the Continental Lumber Company and saw William Currie, the manager, whom he knew to be a member of the legislature, and that Mr. Currie took him into his private office and talked with him privately regarding the lumber cut by the company on crown lands and that this conversation took place after all operators as this company had received reports from their (Continued on page 3.)

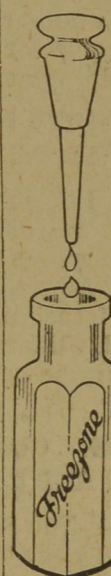
TOMMY TUCKER UP TO DATE.
