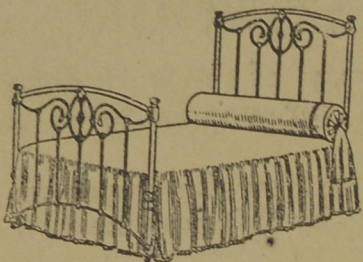


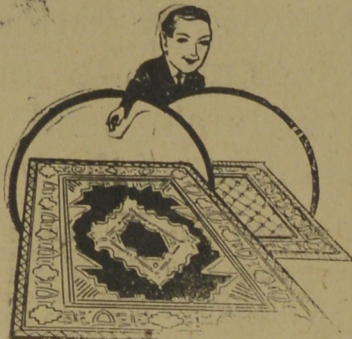

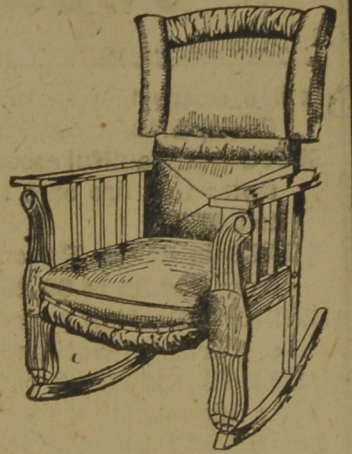

pany's cut, and never told me the amount of the estimate made by him, and I have never at any time, either then or since, seen any estimate made by the said Murchie of the said cut, and I have no knowledge of any estimate made by him other than the amount of the statement received from the Crown Land office.

4. That at the time the said Murchie was at the office as aforesaid, I had no information as to the total amount cut by the said company. At that time the company had not complete returns from its various operators, and the company had made no scale of its own operations.

5. That I never at any time asked the said Murchie to reduce the amount of his scale or to return to the Crown Land Office anything but the correct scale. The said Murchie never asked him if I would use him right if he reduced the scale nor made any suggestion of like effect, and I never at any time intimated to him that any benefit would accrue to him if he made a return of less than the correct amount.

and the statements contained in the ninth and tenth paragraphs of his said affidavit to that effect are wholly untrue.

6. That I have no knowledge whatever of the statements contained in the said affidavit to the effect that the said Murchie changed his statement of the scale of the said lumber, and no intimation was made to me that the said Murchie would do so.

7. That I did not know at the time the said Murchie was at the office the correct amount of the cut of the said company during the said winter of 1916-1917, and I have never known since and do not know today the correct amount of said cut. Some of said lumber is still on the lands, some is still in the stream, and some is still in the booms, and a complete survey has never been made by the said company.

8. That I have never known the amount of the scale allotted by the said Murchie to any single operator for the said company, and I have no knowledge that he did not include in his said return all the operators of the said company.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing it to be true, and knowing it to be of the same force and effect as if made under oath by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.

Affidavit of Daniel Richards.
The affidavit of Mr. Richards was as follows:

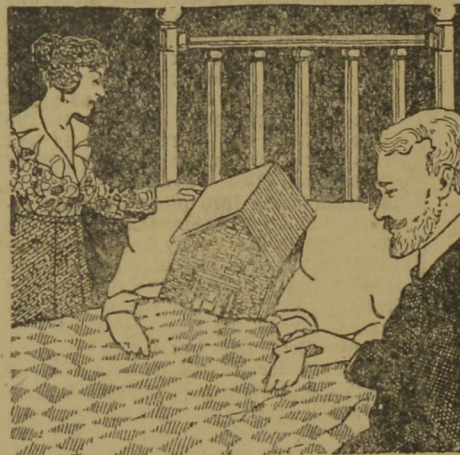
I, Daniel Richards, of the Town of Campbellton, in the County of Restigouche, in the Province of New Brunswick, lumberman, do solemnly declare:

(1) That in the year 1913 I was manager of the Continental Lumber Company, Limited, and since that time I have been and am now President of the said Company.

(2) That in the spring of 1913, and during each spring since that time, Archibald Murchie of the Parish of Durham, in the County of Restigouche, lumber scaler, has come to me to adjust the amount of the scale of the lumber cut by the said company, and we have on each occasion been able to agree on the amount of said scale.

That in the spring of 1917 the said Archibald Murchie adjusted the amount of the said scale with me as president of the said company, and I agreed with the said Murchie on the said amount. I subsequently informed Mr. William Currie, manager of the said company, of the amount which had been arrived at between the said Murchie and me, and the said company afterwards received from the Crown Land Department a statement of the amount in accordance with the said adjustment made between the said Murchie and me, and the said company settled the said account. That the said William Currie had nothing to do with the settling of the said amount with the said Archibald Murchie, but the same was adjusted entirely by me as president of the said Company.

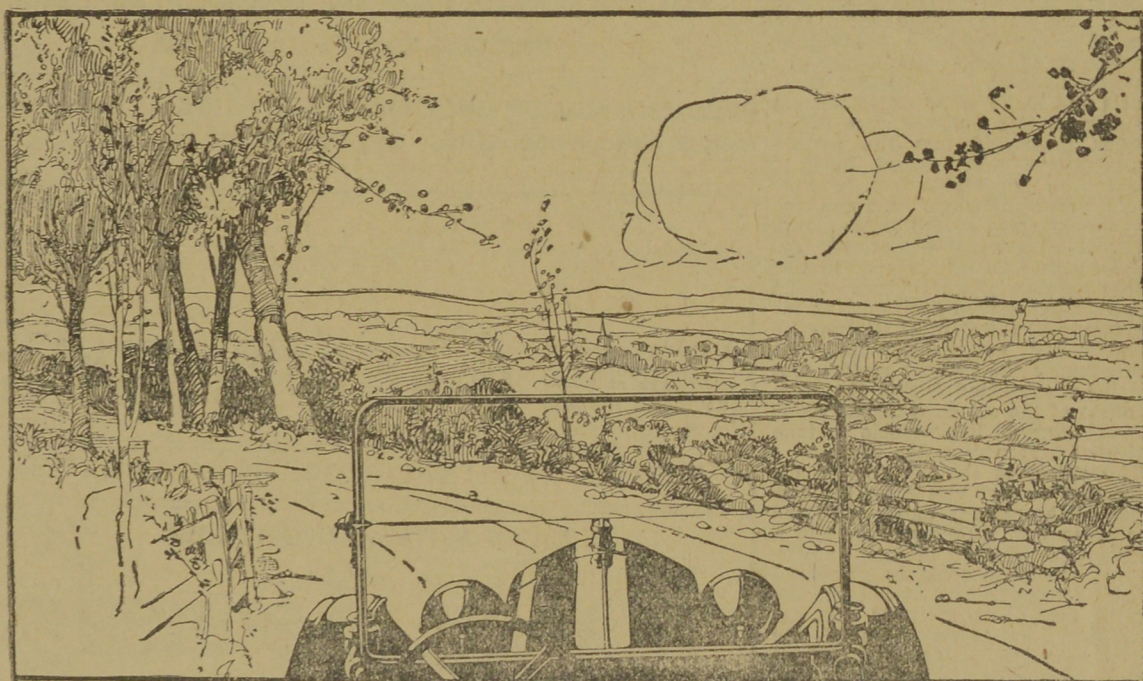

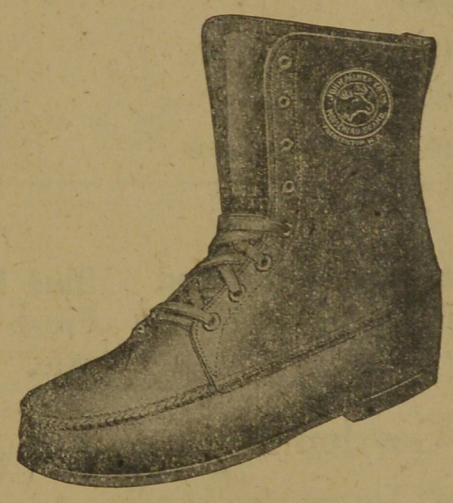
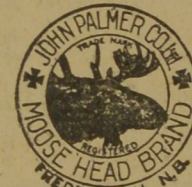
