FOUR KILLED BY A BOMB IN CHICAGO

The I. W. W. Blamed for the Outrage and Some Arrests are Made—Many Persons Injured.

Chicago, Sept. 4.—Four persons were killed and more than seventy-five injured by the explosion of a bomb in a crowded entrance to the federal building at 3.10 o'clock this afternoon.

The explosion not only wrecked the entrance of the building, but shattered every window on the first three floors of two buildings across the street. The outrage was attributed to the I. W. W. by Philip J. Barry, in charge of the local offices of the Department of Justice.

Raids on two headquarters of the I. W. W. within fifteen minutes after the explosion resulted in the arrest of nine men. Several more were taken into custody within the federal building and a woman whose name was suppressed was arrested in a nearby building.

Tonight more than 1500 government agents and the entire city police force was seeking the perpetrator of the outrage.

Miss Violet Foster from Lower Windsor is visiting her cousin Mrs. G. A. Bartlett.

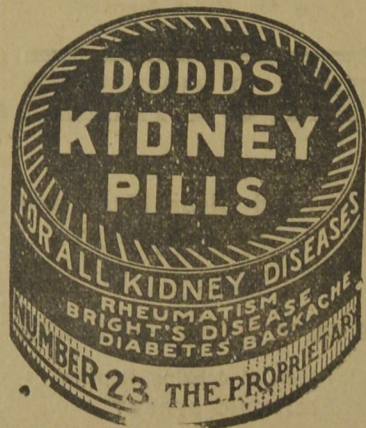

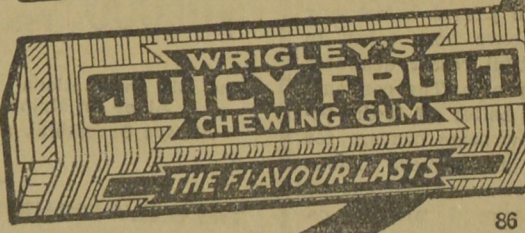
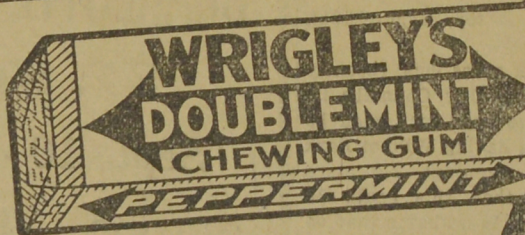
