OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

EDUCATE THE CHILD'S FINGER.

Teach your child to keep his fingers
out of his mouth and nose at all times,"
advises the Public Health Service.

"The greatest agent in the spread
of those diseases whose causative or-
ganism is present in the secretions of
the mouth and nose is the human hand.
Most of us carry our fingers to the
mouth and nose many times daily,
there to implant the germs of disease
which other careless persons have
spread about.

"When surgeons discovered it was
their own infected fingers which car-
ried germs into wounds they undertook
to discover a means whereby their
hands could be rendered surgically
clean. The whole realm of chemistry
was ransacked for agents which would
cleanse infected hands. The scrub-
bings and immersions to which medi-
cal hands were subjected are even yet
a tender memory to the surgeons of
that period. But all of these efforts
proved useless. Surgeons finally had
to adopt rubber gloves.

"Try as you will, you can't by any
known method keep your hands free
from germs," states the Public Health
Service, "hence the importance of
teaching children to keep their hands
away from both mouth and nose."
