FOOD LOYALTY.

Mr. Hoover says that if you eat
plentifully of such vegetables as on-
ions, turnips, beets, potatoes and par-
snips during this spring and summer,

but serve yourself as well.

by the amount of meat one eats, or
saves; but with an injunction laid on
the Canadian people to let our sold-
iers and our Allies have meat first, it
is the part of loyalty to turn to substi-
tutes.

Carrot Soup.

2 cups carrot water,
2 cups chopped carrots,
4 slices onion,
2 cups milk,
2 tablespoons butter,
4 tablespoons flour,
Salt and pepper.

Mode—Cook onion and chopped car-
rots in water till tender, press through
strainer and add 2 cups of liquid in
which they were boiled. Add scalded
milk and thicken with butter and flour
cooked together and season. Serve
very hot.

Oatmeal Muffins.

1 cup cooked oatmeal,
1½ cups flour,
½ cup milk,
1 egg,
½ teaspoon salt,
2 level tablespoons melted butter-
ine,
4 level teaspoons baking powder,
2 level tablespoons sugar.

Mode—Mix and sift flour, sugar,
salt and baking powder, add half the
milk and the egg well beaten. Mix
the remainder of the milk with the
cooked oatmeal and add to first mix-
ture; beat thoroughly then add the
melted butterine. Bake in greased
gem pans. Tested by Mrs. Allan K.
Grimmer.

Cornflake Drop Cakes.

½ cup butter,
1 cup sugar,
1½ cups flour,
2 eggs,
2 eggs,
4 cups corn flakes,
½ teaspoon soda,
1½ teaspoons cream of tartar,
Vanilla flavoring.

Mode—Cream butter and sugar, add
eggs well beaten, then dry ingredients.
Dissolve soda and cream of tartar in
a little hot water. Drop on greased
pan and cook in a moderate oven.
