AMERICAN INTEREST IN POPULAR GOVERNMENT

The Present Not the First Time the Great Republic Has Taken a Stand Against German Militarism—An Unsuccessful Attempt to Overthrow German Autocracy in 1848.

The present war is not the first time that the United States took its stand against German autocracy. Under the title "American Interest in Popular Government Abroad," Prof. T. B. Greene of the University of Illinois, quotes from the archives in Washington passages showing our policy toward the great effort of the German people in 1848 to overthrow autocracy, says an American exchange. This pamphlet has just been issued by the Committee of Public Information.

When Carl Schurz and Franz Sigel were fighting the Prussian autocracy in 1848, Mr. Clayton, secretary of state under President Zachary Taylor, wrote to our envoy in Berlin words that apply equally well today:

Message to Envoy.

"We understand that there are, at this time, two parties in Germany, each seeking to establish a constitution for a Germanic empire; and that the essential difference between them consists in this—that one of them desires to form a constitution which has for its basis a recognition of the principle that the people are the true sources of all power; and the other, a constitution based on the despotic principle that kings hold their power by divine right. It is hardly necessary for me to say that all the sympathies of the government and the people of the United States are with the former party."

When the representatives of the various German states met at Frankfurt in 1848 to organize a new federal government based on the authority of the German people, our minister, Mr. Donelson, was instructed by President Taylor "to proceed" to Frankfurt and there, as the diplomatic representative of the United States recognize the provisional government of the new German confederation, provided you shall find such a government in successful operation."

Donelson was informed that his mission to Frankfurt originated "in the strong desire of this government to manifest a proper degree of sympathy for the efforts of the German people to ameliorate their condition by the adoption of a form of government which should secure their liberties and promote their happiness."

Sent Warship for Kossuth.

This same interest on the part of the young American republic was manifested for Louis Kossuth and his comrades in their struggle to free Hungary from the despotic power of the Hapsburgs, and when these revolutionists failed and fled to Turkey the United States sent a warship to Turkey to fetch Kossuth to America. Unfortunately for Germany and the world the Prussian military machine was able in 1848 to crush the German hopes of self-government, and the Vienna government put down the Hungarian aspirations.

But the realization of the United States that its government is safe

only in a world made safe for democracy has been voiced on other occasions. Daniel Webster pleaded the cause of Greece in 1824 in words that parallel the passages of President Wilson's war message. President Monroe's sympathy for Greece was strong, and several members of his cabinet proposed sending vessels of the United States navy to co-operate with the Greeks.

Striking utterances of our public men from Washington to Lincoln, quoted in this pamphlet, show that our foreign policy has never for a moment been blind to the unity of interest among liberal self-governing peoples the world over and has never hesitated to warn European autocracy that continent is not a place where they can breed their intrigues or build up hostility to democracy.
