**Kidney Bean Stew.**

- 1 cup beans,
- 1 small onion,
- 2 tablespoons rice,
- 2 cups canned tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons fat,
- 2 tablespoons flour,
- Salt, pepper.

Soak beans over night, cover with water and work until nearly soft; add cup-up onion, tomatoes and rice well washed, cook until rice is thoroughly done; thicken with butter and flour cooked together, and add seasonings. Care must be taken that the beans do not cook till broken up; they should be soft, but remain whole.

**Chocolate Pudding.**

- ¾ cup sugar,
- 2 tablespoons cocoa,
- 1½ tablespoons cornstarch,
- 1 tablespoon flour,
- 1 tablespoon butter,
- 2 cups boiling water,
- Vanilla flavoring.

Put sugar, cocoa, cornstarch, flour and butter in double saucepan and mix; add boiling water, stirring well to prevent lumping; cook for 20 min., and when slightly cool add flavoring and turn in glass bowl or individual glasses. Serve cold with either whipped cream or custard. Cost, 10c; serves 4 persons.

**Custard.**

- 1 egg,
- 1 cup milk,
- 1 tablespoon sugar,
- Vanilla flavoring.

Scald milk, pour on egg and sugar mixed together; return to fire and cook till thickened; cool and flavor.
