## BIG BLAZE AT KANSAS CITY

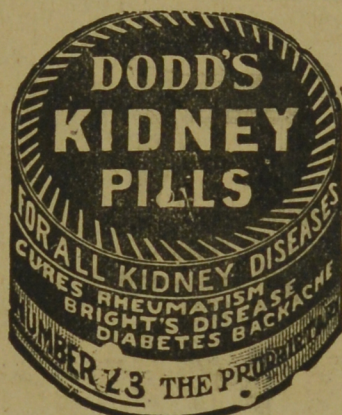
Kansas City, April 5.—Buildings housing ten large wholesale and manufacturing concerns and a number of smaller structures were destroyed by fire tonight. Several other buildings over an area of six and eight blocks were more or less damaged. The fire was centered in the heart of the whole sale district. The cause of the fire is unknown. Unofficial estimates received show a minimum of \$2,500,000 to as high as \$7,000,000. This latter figure was declared to be "wild guess work".

## DISTRIBUTION OF SEED GRAIN, 1918

GOOD SEED IS SCARCE. Place your order now, with your County Council. The Department of Agriculture has ordered 56,000 bushels of oats and 8,000 bushels of wheat.

Oats will be sold for \$1.32 per bushel, in bulk car lots, or \$1.38 in bags in car lots laid down.

Wheat will be sold for \$3.00 per bushel, in bags car lots or f.o.b., distributing point for smaller orders.

Local freights will be paid by purchaser. County Councillors and Agricultural Societies should place car lot orders immediately, stating destination for cars. Delivery not guaranteed unless orders placed within three weeks, because of transportation difficulties.

New Brunswick is expected to bread herself for the duration of the war. EVERY FARMER SHOULD GROW SOME WHEAT.
