
BIG BLAZE AT KANSAS CITY

Kansas City, April 5—Buildings housing ten large wholesale and manufacturing concerns and a number of smaller structures were destroyed by fire tonight. Several other buildings fire tonight. Several other buildings over an area of six and eight blocks were more or less damaged. The fire was centered in the heart of the whole sale district. The cause of the fire is unknown. Unofficial estimates received show a minimum of \$2,500,000 to as high as \$7,000,000. This latter figure was declared to be "wild guess work".
