FIRST STEP TOWARD PEACE CELEBRATION

City Council Appointed a Special Committee of Three Last Night—Local Organizations to be Asked to Co-operate—Street Committee Empowered to Sell the City Team of Horses—Aberdeen Street Extension.

The City Council last night took the first step toward celebrating the victorious end of the war by appointing a committee which will represent the city government in any organized celebration which may be attempted upon the reception of the word of Germany coming to the Allies' terms.

On the motion of Ald. Wilkinson who introduced the subject it was decided to appoint a committee of three Mayor Hanson named as the committee Ald. Wilkinson, Ald. Cooper and Ald. Shea.

Speaking on the matter His Worship said that he believed the end of the war was not far off and he intended to proclaim a civic holiday to fittingly mark the close of the war. It would be the proper thing for the Great War Veterans' Association, the Labor Council and similar bodies to cooperate with the City Council committee in organizing a celebration. It also was probable that a National Peace Holiday would be named and observed permanently in all Allied Countries.

The meeting was a brief one the low temperature and the absence of heating apparatus suppressing any tendency to prolong the proceedings. All members were present.

Tax Collections

Ald. Reid reported as follows on tax collections:
October, 1917, \$1,548.37; October, 1918, \$1,136.53.

Ald. Baxter reported for the Municipal Home Committee that \$149.32 had been expended during October for maintenance of the Home and \$103.90 for outside relief. The latter had been extra large on account of the influenza epidemic. On his motion a cheque for \$400 was ordered to be issued in favor of the Commissioner.

The customary cheque for \$100 was ordered to issue in favor of the revisors.

Ten Thousand in Victory Loan

On the suggestion of Ald. Reid who said he had consulted with the Mayor on the matter, the amount of sinking funds to be invested in the Victory Loan 1918, was fixed at \$10,000 it being thought that a round sum would be better.

To Be Recast

Ald. Shea for the committee on hack men's petition reported on the proposed amendment of the city bylaw relating to the licensing of hacks and the establishment of rates. Under the proposed amendment a motor vehicle

is not classed as a hack and must pay an annual license fee of fifteen dollars. The schedule of fares is as follows: for each passenger to any point between Old Government House and Gregory's Bridge 35 cents; to any point outside that area but between the upper city line and W. J. Scott's residence, 60 cents; to the University of New Brunswick, 60 cents; between the hours of midnight and 5 a. m. double fare; children under one year old to be carried free, over that age to be charged half fare; one grip suitcase, handbag, etc., per passenger to be carried free; for each trunk, 10 cents, for each flight of stairs up or down which a trunk is carried, 10 cents.

There was considerable discussion concerning the intention of the amendment with regard to motor vehicles and their license fee and the resolution finally was withdrawn by Ald. Shea to be recast and presented at the next regular monthly meeting.

To Sell City Team

Ald. McKay for the Street Committee moved that the committee be authorized to sell the small horse-roller, the small stone crusher and all junk belonging to the Street Department and also the city's team of horses if a suitable price can be secured.

Speaking to his motion Ald. McKay stated that the city was not large enough to maintain and work a team of horses to advantage and for that reason he advocated disposing of the team. His motion was carried.

Also on the motion of Ald. McKay it was decided to release Modern Realities Limited from the agreement made by it relative to Alexandra St. water main July 12th 1915, on condition that all interest charges now due be paid by that company.

Ald. Shea for the Water Committee presented a report showing that the cost of pumping water at the pumping station had decreased to a marked extent.

Aberdeen Street Extension

On motion it was decided to accept the offer of the U. N. B. Senate of land for the extension of Aberdeen Street from Church Street to the C. G. R. right-of-way at the price of \$1,200.

On this matter Ald. McKay said that the University had sold its land to advantage. He considered the price excessive when it was considered there were only three or four small houses on the street. However the matter was finally settled and it was just as well it was. Twice he had almost succeeded in getting the matter settled by jury but each time the City Council had refused to advance the money.


