APPLE SHORTCAKE

Mix thoroughly one pound of cheese, one and one-half tablespoonfuls of cream, one tablespoonful of chopped parsley and salt to taste. First fill a rectangular tin mold with cold water to chill and wet the surface, line the bottom with waxed paper, then pack in three layers of the cheese, putting two or three paraisel strips of pimento, fresh or canned, between the ayers. Cover with waxed paper and set in a cool place until ready to serve then run a knife around the sides and then run a kine around the sides and invert the mold. Cut in slices and serve on lettuce leaves with French dressing and wafers, or thin bread and butter sandwiches. Minced olives may be used instead of the parsley and chopped nuts may also be added.

Pumpkin Pie Filling.

Sufficient for 5 pies. cans pumpkin ozs. corn syrup ozs. molasses 2 teaspoon nutmeg

teaspoon cinnamon tablespoons corn starch ¼ teaspoon salt

Apple Pie Filling.

Sufficient for 6 pies. 2 teaspoon nutmeg

Raisin Pie Filling.

Sufficient for 10 pies. 4 lbs. seeded raisins 3 quarts water

½ package corn starch 12 ozs. molasses

12 ozs. white corn syrup 1 teaspoon nutmeg Cook for half an hour before putting n pastry shell.

Apple shortcake is made with a baking powder crust, using half corn meal flour. Bake in two half-inch layers, buttering the lower before placing in the oven. Bake until brown. Just before serving remove top and fill liberally with rather thick, unstrained apple sauce, sweetened with maple syrup or honey and flavored with a little lemon juice; add a small piece of butter. Place more of the apple on top and serve with or without whipped cream.

SQUASH CUSTARDS

Press dry cooked squash through a sieve and to each cupful of the pulp add two tablespoonfuls of melted eleo, four tablespoonful of milk, salt and paprika to taste and the yolks of two well-beaten eggs. Let the mixture cool, fold in the stiffly whipped egg whites and turn quickly into buttered moulds. Set in a pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven. Serve as hot as possible.
