

# **BOASTING OF**

#### (New York Sun)

Was ever a more amazing official document conceived than that which the German government is said to be circulating in Spain! Four years ago it would have been considered impossible, but we are learning more every day about the Teutonic mind. This booklet, written in Spanish, contains a warning to neutral nations. "See what we'd do to you, too, if we get a chance," is its purport. The idea persists that all non-German nations must necessarily be so frightened by the horrid achievements of the Prus sian that they can be scared into ser vility. It remains the most curious delusion of the Teuton mind in spite of the accumulating mass of evidence as to its futility. Indeed, it can hardly be said that even the light headed Russians were frightened into accepting a German "peace". Terror was not their compelling motive.

This precious document boasts o the enormous amount of loot gathered in Belgium and France, ranging from military spoils down to such items as "417 high grade watches." It gloats over the destruction of four cathedrals and scores of churches. It speci fies the money fines levied. And most mends German maltreatment and starvation of the war prisoners! The only item omitted is the number of women outraged, the total of men and girls carried off into slavery and of children tortured. The omission is curious; probably an oversight. Perhaps the "417 watches" were regarded as more important.

Its conclusion is: If there are any still thinking of siding with the Allies let them take warning from the fate of the others."

The document should, indeed, have an effect on neutral nations, but hardly that anticipated by Germany.




## MAKES APPEAL FOR HARMONY




