HELPFUL KITCHEN HINTS.

Some May be New to You, Some You
May Have Known Before and For-
gotten.

A steamed pudding may be prepared
in a double boiler if one has not a
steamer.

Sponge cake batter will beat up a
lot lighter in a crock than in a gran-
iteware pan.

Wet eggs before dropping them in
boiling water, and they are not so
likely to crack as when put in dry.

A tablespoon of water added to
one egg, then beaten up, makes the
egg do almost double duty.

When brown sugar becomes lumpy,
put the sack beside a bowl of water
in a jar or airtight bin and the sugar
absorbs enough moisture to soften it.

Water can be heated in a plated tin
teakettle in a very much shorter time
than is required for heating in a gran-
ite teakettle.

Jelly may easily be paraffined by
putting a piece of paraffine wax in the
glass before the jelly poured in. The
wax melts, passes to the top, filtering
the jelly.

The piano stool can easily be of
more value in the kitchen than in the
parlor. Keep it out of the way, but
where it can easily be pulled out and
made high or low to suit table or sink
or any kind of kitchen work that
comes during the day.

POTATO AND PEANUT LOAF.

1 cup mashed potatoes, 1 cup pea-
nut butter, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons finely
chopped parsley, 2 teaspoons salt, 2
teaspoons grated onion, half teaspoon
grated nutmeg, three-quarter teaspoon
paprika. To the hot mashed potatoes
add the peanut butter, well beaten egg
and other ingredients. Put in greased
baking pan and bake in a hot oven
35 to 40 minutes.

EGGS POACHED IN MILK.

Cook in double boiler enough milk
to cover your eggs. Get milk boiling
hot, drop in your eggs and cook as
best pleases taste. Prepare slices of
toasted bread, lift eggs from milk and
place on the toast. Season the milk
and pour over toast and eggs.

VENETIAN EGG.

Slice 4 medium onions, cook until
yellow in two teaspoons of bacon fat,
add to onions half a pound of cheese
cut fine, 2 well beaten eggs, 1 cup to-
matoes, half cup of milk, half a tea-
spoon mustard, 1 teaspoon salt, a dash
of paprika. Cook all in double boiler
until creamy. Serve on toast or crack-
ers (enough for five people).

SCIENTIFIC FORESTRY

safeguard the future; how about the
development of a permanent forest
policy. Do not mistake my meaning.
These things must never be forgot-
ten by any public service engaged in
forest management. Forestry, in the
broad conception, is merely a great
form of agriculture; the harvesting of
Nature's successive timber crops, and
we in the West, in our business of
harvesting the present enormous crop
must not neglect to safeguard in
every practicable way we can the next
crop that is now growing.

And here's a point to be considered.
Trained men are needed in the work
of forestry. What means of training
does British Columbia provide? Nearly
every western State deals with this
question. Oregon has a forest school.
California has a forest school. So
has Washington, Idaho, Montana, and
Colorado. Logging engineering is
being taught as a profession, just like
civil engineering. But British Colum-
bia provides no training whatever,
though forest industries are the most
important ones. Our young men must
go and study at Seattle, or (if they
have the money) go back East. With
all its various professional equip-
ment the University of British Colum-
bia has no forest school.

And, again, the foreign buyer of
British Columbia lumber, the city en-
gineer back east, architects the world
over, ask us, when we try to push
the sale of British Columbia lumber,
how strong is it; what are its qual-
ities; what engineering tests have
been made of it? We must answer
none! and lose the business. All we
can do is to distribute hand books for
engineers published by our go-ahead
American competitors. It is not good
business when a firm has to send its

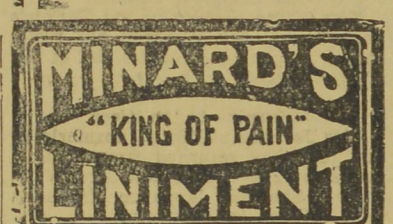
