VILLAGES ON THE MARNE ARE LOOTED BY HUNS

Enemy Soldiers Sneak in at Night With Wheelbarrows and Carts and Remove Everything that is Portable---Huns Have Been Deserted by Their Owners---Boshes Keep up Their Work of Devastation.

With the American Army on the Marne, June 11.—Our men on Hill 204 can see sights which bring home to them the stuff the invading German armies are made of. The Americans there are from Syracuse, a city about the size of Chateau Thierry, although even they admit, hardly as picturesque.

For the last two days the Germans have been systematically looting the northern part of the city right under the eyes of the Americans.

The main German position is on the heights a little north of Chateau Thierry, so when dusk comes they

can be seen coming down in little parties with wheelbarrows or carts. They can be seen entering the city's streets, but the first streak of the dawn finds them skulking back again to the heights, with their wheelbarrows and carts laden with stolen furniture, clocks, bedding, pictures—all kinds of things which are portable. Almost every prisoner taken now has his pockets filled with jewelry and French coins.

Two were brought in today, wounded, and they had in their possession several pairs of children's shoes.

Imitate the Crown Prince

Perhaps the Americans should not be surprised, for this army is commanded by the All Highest Crown Prince whose kleptomaniac should be well known but which fills Americans here with particular abhorrence because in the deserted villages where they have been billeted they haven't touched a thing, and most of the houses remained filled with household goods, just as when their owners left them.

Strict orders have been issued to the Americans forbidding them to take anything, but the orders seem hardly needed and the military police have had no occasion to enforce them.

There is nothing more pitiful than to see these Marne villages, at first sight still giving the appearance of their wonted life, but which are de-

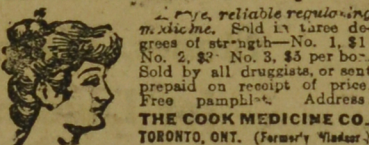

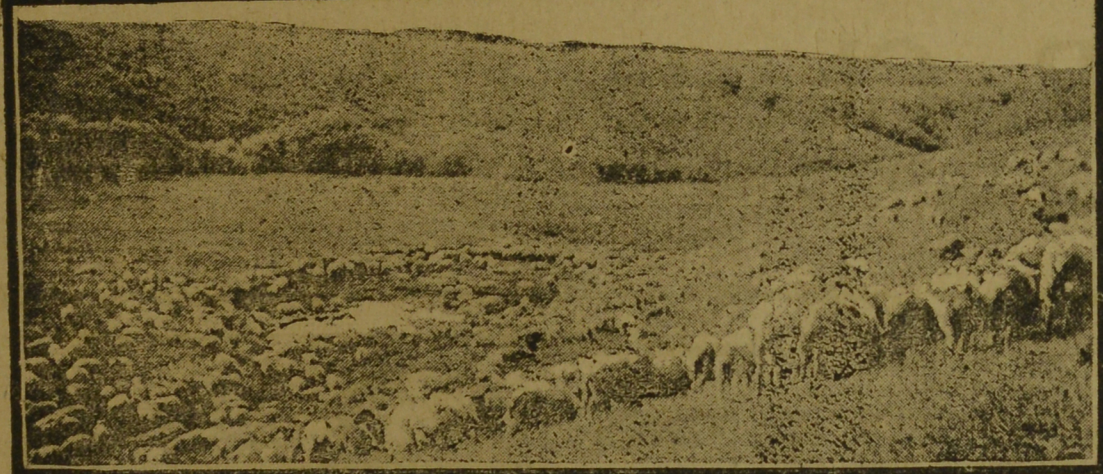

SHEEP ON THE FARM



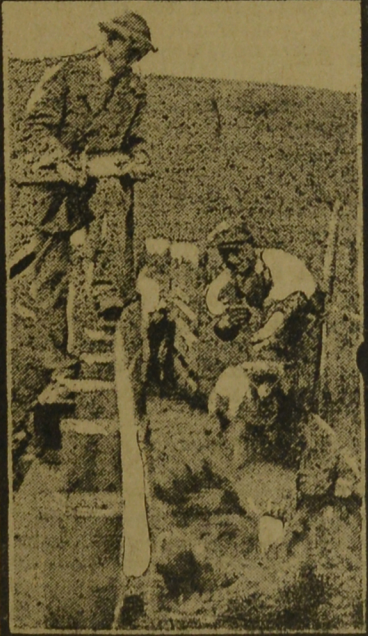
AN official of the Dominion Government, who is at present at Lethbridge, Alberta, superintending the grading of the wool in that district, computes that the clip of the Southern Alberta Wool Growers will be about a million and a half pounds. This is an increase for this association of twenty-five per cent. over last year. Although it is yet too early to make an estimate of the increase expected throughout the whole of the Canadian Prairie West, it is not expected that the average increase will be less than that of the Southern Alberta Wool Growers Association. In other words, an increase of approximately twenty-five per cent. is looked for in the wool clip of Western Canada over that of last year. Shearing has now begun and will be in full swing before the middle of June. The increase in the number of lambs this year has been a very satisfactory one, being between one hundred and one hundred and fifty per cent. of the size of the flock.

The Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers Association, which was formed last year, is all ready to handle this year's clip. Two warehouses have been secured in Toronto, Ontario, to which the wool of this Association will be forwarded and stored for selling. A large majority of the Canadian sheep raisers are members of the association, but it is expected that much wool will be handled for non-members, so that several million pounds will be sold through this channel during the season.

The growth of the sheep industry among the farmers of Western Canada during the last few years has been a remarkable one. At least it appears so at first glance, especially to those who do not know the country. But it is not so surprising to those who know the natural advantages of the country. Speaking generally there is no part of the continent where a farmer can engage in sheep raising with greater prospects of success than in Western Canada. The climate, abundance of food and

pure water, make the country excellently adapted for this useful industry. The comparatively low price of the land here also gives the farm sheepman in Western Canada an advantage over his brother farther south. It is only during the last three or four years, however, that the sheep industry has begun to make any marked headway on the farms in Western Canada. The high quality of the wool, together with the great demand and the good prices, has opened the eyes of the farmers to the possibilities of the industry, and it is growing as fast as the difficulty in securing breeding stock will allow.

It is to the farms that we are to look for the further development of the sheep industry. The opportunities for sheep raising on the range are becoming scarcer every year. That this circumstance is an advantage to the industry in the more intensive farming districts there can be no doubt. Up to a few years ago it was difficult for farmers in such districts to make headway in competition with the sheepman, whose flocks ranged over a large stretch of country. The high prices of wool and mutton have also given a great impetus to the farm sheep business, and the continued development of the industry will contribute to the world's food and clothing supply.
