SUNK BY A BRITISH MINE, SAY THE HUNS

Amsterdam, July 3.—The sinking of the British hospital ship Llandovery Castle, announced by the British Admiralty to have been sent to the bottom by an enemy submarine with the probable loss of more than 200 lives, was due to her striking a British mine, in all probability, says a semi-official note from Berlin. "Like all similar assertions of the British Admiralty," the note reads, "the assertion in this case that a submarine was responsible for the fate of the Llandovery Castle is probably incorrect. It appears from later news that no one on board the steamer observed a U-boat or a torpedo. In all probability the cause of the loss will be found to be attributable to a British mine."

COUNTY LICENSE FEE

Coun. Seymour took the same ground and moved in amendment that the secretary treasurer be given one hundred dollars.

Coun. Allen seconded the amendment.

Coun. Stairs suggested that the matter lay over until the committee on Seed Grain presented its report and moved to that effect. His amendment was carried.

Road Tax

There was lengthy discussion concerning the collection of Road Tax. Coun. Manuel moved that all parishes which had not already appointed collecting justices, proceed to appoint them and that lists of delinquents be placed in their hands.

Coun. Hugh Smith said it would not be practical to appoint a collector justice in every parish.

Coun. Cowperthwaite expressed a like opinion.

Coun. Hugh Smith objected that the county had nothing to do with the Road Tax and the secretary treasurer should not be required to act in this connection without salary. Let the provincial government handle the matter.

The motion was lost.

Coun. Allen made a statement of the activities of the printing committee. It was decided to have a report from the committee the next day.

Councillors' Pay Increased

Coun. Pond moved that the pay of the councillors be the maximum allowed under the law. Coun. Hugh Smith seconded the motion.

The motion was carried. The pay is five dollars per day.

Coun. Pat Graham suggested that the councillors get down to business earlier each session and get through quicker.

Coun. Stairs thought the July Session should be shorter. He had thought the amount was only three dollars not five.

Coun. Hugh Smith believed that the maximum pay with shorter session would be the proper thing.

Tax on Junk Dealers

Coun. Seymour brought up the matter of imposing a license fee upon all junk dealers in York County. He moved that a fee of ten dollars be required of every junk dealer or his agent operating in York County the regulation to go into effect August 1st, 1918.

Coun. Pond claimed that the collectors of old material performed a valuable service to the people of the country. Ten dollars was too great a fee. A small one would be different. He would oppose the motion.

The motion was carried.

On the motion of Coun. Inch the law relating to the running of cattle on the islands and intervals of the Parishes of Bright, Douglas and Kingsclear was amended.

Patriotic Fund

Coun. Robert Graham brought up the matter of Patriotic Fund allotments. The councillors should endeavor to see that none of the money was wasted.

Warden Brewer said that he believed that the Patriotic Fund in the present form would cease to exist after the present year.


Coun. Everett and Coun. Allen made brief addresses describing the work of the Patriotic Fund Committee.

Coun. Seymour stated that the Patriotic Committee was extremely efficient. He also asked what was the amount required from York County. The original amount of \$400,000 required from the province had been increased to \$518,000. Would York County be faced with a deficit? It seemed as if the county was not being dealt with fairly.

Coun. Pond and Coun. Everett also talked on the matter. Coun. Everett said that the council had better wait until York County was required to pay the extra amount.

The County solicitor quoted from the act governing the matter showing that the assessment is required for purposes connected with the war other than the Patriotic Fund.

The Council then adjourned.


