WHEATLESS BREAD.

A Government Recipe.

Make a sponge by mixing 1% cupfuls of liquid with 1 tablespoonful of corn syrup, half cake of yeast dissolved in water, and two teaspoonfuls of salt with 3% cupfuls of barley flour or 2% cupfuls of ground rolled oats. Add 21/2 cupfuls of corn flour. In mixing the sponge, use only half the flours called for and allow the sponge to stand in a warm place and rise for two hours. Then add the other half of the flour mixture; work into the dough one egg, well beaten, and shape into loaves. Put in bread pan, brush top with melted fat, allow to rise to double bulk and bake in a hot oven for one hour.

Either barley or ground rolled oats flour is always used in the wheatless loaf-bread, but there are several variations of the second flour to be used with them. For instance, the recipe just given calls for 21/2 cupfuls of corn flour to be used with the barley flour or oats, but if more convenient to use, equally good results are obtained by substituting for the corn flour either 21/8 cupfuls of rice flour or 23/4 cupfuls of sweet potato flour, or 21/8 cupfuls of tapioca flour.

WAR JOHNNY CAKE.

Ingredients: Corn meal, 1 cup, boiling water 4 cups, salt 1 teaspoon; no milk, no eggs, no baking powder, no These measurements make three cakes baked in pie tins.

Pour the boiling water on the corn meal and salt, about one cupful at a time ,stirring briskly to keep from forming lumps. Pour this batter into well-buttered hot pie tins. Spread evenly over tins, then take a tablespoonful of cream and smooth over the top. This makes a brown crust on the top when baked.

Bake in a hot oven about 40 min-

COCOA

Four tablespoons cocoa, 2 table spoons sugar, 1 cup water, 4 cups milk . Mix cocoa and sugar with the water and boil for 10 minutes. Stir this syrup into the hot milk and cook over hot water for one-half hour.

A glass of milk and a cup of cocoa are high in food value. Coffee and tea are only stimulants, containing no food value except that contained in the sugar and milk served with them.
