### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

#### GRAPE RECIPES.

Unfermented Grape Juice.  
(Without sugar.)

Wash and stem fresh ripe grapes. Crush and boil the fruit and drain off the juice. Have sterilized pears or bottles ready in the water-bath outfit used for canning fruit, and fill the bottles with juice. Do not cork or cover. Fill the boiler with cool water up to the necks of the bottles and bring to a boil. Boil for ten minutes. If some juice has evaporated fill up the bottles, cork tight and dip the cork and bottle top in melted paraffin or sealing wax to make it airtight.

#### Canned Grapes.

Wash and stem ripe grapes. Make a syrup of 1 quart of water and three-quarters of a pound of sugar. Fill the jars loosely with uncooked grapes, pour the syrup over the fruit until within an inch of the top. Partly seal and bring to a boil in water bath. Cook ten minutes. Fill the jars up with syrup and seal tight.

#### French Marmalade. (Grapes and Pears.)

Use equal weights of stemmed ripe grapes and peeled ripe pears. Simmer the grapes alone until soft, cooking in a very little water. Press the grapes through a colander and add the uncooked pears, sliced thin. Sweeten the mixture to taste and simmer slowly until thick. Seal in small jars or jelly glasses.

#### Whew! Fish for Me!

Why eat pork or beef when meat is needed overseas and when there's as good fish in the sea as ever came out of it?

If there is one country in the world more than another whose heritage is a wonderful supply of fish, that country is Canada. Canadian fishermen produced over 800,000,000 pounds of fish last year, but the consumption within the Dominion was only about one-quarter of that amount.

Last year the people of Canada ate only 29 pounds of fish per capita. This year our objective should be at least 52 pounds. A pound a week all round. Housewives should learn all about fish and how to cook the many varieties of sea, lake and river fish of Canada. The recipe book issued by the Food Board on the cooking of fish will help. It costs only five cents, and can be obtained from Ottawa or from any of the provincial committees.

### MORE TURKS HEMMED IN

London, Sept. 26.—The fourth Turkish army on the Palestine front virtually surrounded in the region east of the Jordan and faces annihilation by General Allenby's forces, today's advisers show. The total of prisoners already taken was increased today to 45,000. The annihilation of the fourth army, now hoped for, would complete the cleaning up of the Turkish forces in Palestine, accounting for about 20,000 Turkish soldiers.

### AMUSEMENT TAX ORDER

ALL PERSONS promoting or directing entertainments of whatever sort or description, are requested to observe carefully the following addition to the rules and regulations passed by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council with regard to the collection of the Amusement Tax:

"No entertainment of whatever sort or description to which an admission fee is charged and the proceeds of which are not wholly for patriotic, church or charitable purposes, shall be held without a permit allowing the said entertainment to be held and providing at the same time for a supply of amusement tax tickets necessary in connection therewith. If such entertainment is held without a permit from the Amusement Tax Inspector, the promoters of the same shall be liable to the penalties provided for in the 11th section of the Theatres and Cinematographs Act".

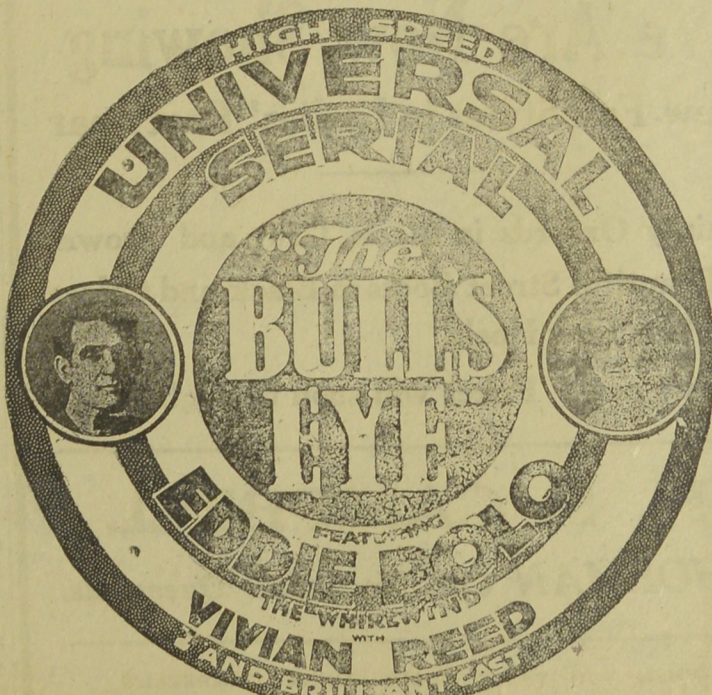
