WORST ENEMY OF QUEBEC

Notorious Agitator has Done Nothing but Make Trouble for His Province---Legislature of the Province Has Voiced the Real Sentiments of the People---English and French Must Work in Harmony for the Good of Canada.

The sober second thought of the people of Quebec is leading them to realize that Bourassa so far from being their champion and deliverer, has been their worst enemy. He has secured for them nothing but trouble; nor can he achieve anything else for them so long as he persists in his present misguided course. Thanks to the efforts—often misunderstood in other provinces—of such French-Canadian leaders as Sir Wilfrid Laurier

and Sir Lomer Gouin, the people of Quebec have not gone over to Bourassa. The real sentiments of Quebec have now been made known by the legislature of that province. They are not the sentiments of Bourassa and the Nationalists.

English-speaking Canada should not only welcome the Quebec attitude but should accept it as affording an opportunity of bringing about a better feeling and that actual unity which is so essential to our national well being and progress. Faults there have been on both sides, but if our political leaders, newspapers, clergy, and others will in future emphasize our points of common interest and endeavor in a sensible, amicable and constructive spirit to smooth away our points of disagreement in a word if the national welfare is kept to the fore and personal, political and sectarian prejudices and interests are subordinated to the national welfare—the way is open to creating a real unity of sentiment and action.

TO SAVE FLOUR

Ottawa, Feb. 19. — Information has been received by the Canada food board that the Poster Advertising Association, representing nearly all of the bill posting plants in Canada, has decided that in future no members of the association shall use wheat flour for the bill posters' paste. As a substitute for wheat flour the poster men will use Cassava flour and a low grade of corn starch. This action is expected to save a very considerable amount of the low grade of wheat flour.
