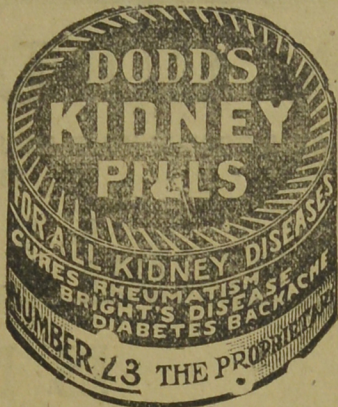

THEY NOW GET THEIR TOBACCO DUTY FREE

Canada's Convalescent Men
Rejoice at New Order Approved by the Governor General.

"Smokes" free from excise duty in the canteens of the military convalescent hospitals and clearing depots has caused general jubilation among the wounded men returned to Canada for treatment. The news that the Governor General in Council had ordered that the hospital canteens be granted the same privilege enjoyed by the canteens in camps and be allowed to sell tobacco and cigarettes free from excise duty has made the convalescent men see double. Their income is automatically increased and life looks twice as bright.

The question of duty free tobacco in the hospital canteens has been a long mooted question among the men. They could not see why they who had been overseas and done their part in the fight should not have the privileges extended to the men who had not seen overseas service. EFFECT OF GAS.

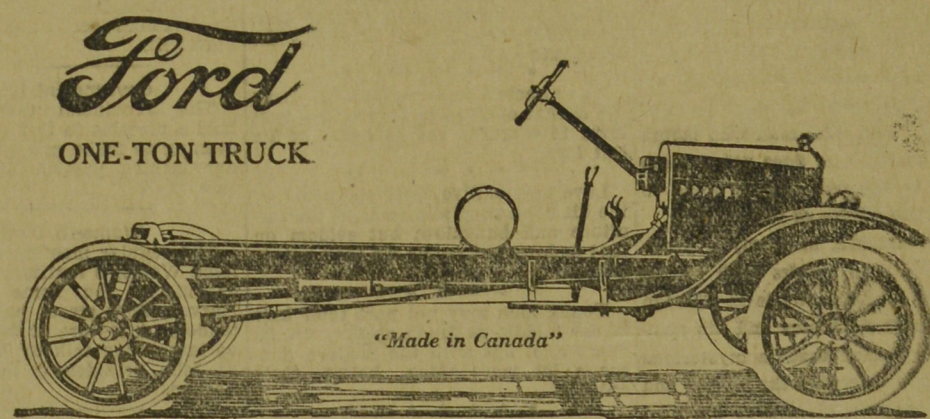
