MORE POTATO RECIPES.

Curried Potatoes.

One-quarter cup of fat, 1 small onion,
3 cups cold boiled potato cubes, 1 cup
milk or 1 cup stock, half tablespoon
curry powder, half tablespoon lemon
juice.

Heat fat, add chopped onion, cook
until onion is yellow. Add remainder
of ingredients and cook until potatoes
have absorbed liquid.

Potato Casserole.

Two tablespoons fat, 2 tablespoons
potato flour, half teaspoon mustard,
1½ cups broth chicken, lamb or meal
quarter teaspoon of pepper, 2 cups of
sliced potatoes.

Make a sauce of the fat, potato
flour, salt, mustard and broth. Ar-
range in layers with potatoes in a
greased baking dish. Bake 40 min-
utes, or until potatoes are tender.

Potato Muffins.

One cup mashed potato, 1 cup po-
tato flour or corn flour, 3 teaspoons of
baking powder, half teaspoon salt, 1
egg well beaten, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon
fat, 1 tablespoon sugar.

Mix baking powder with flour, add
salt and potato, then beaten egg, milk,
melted fat and sugar. Beat well and
bake 40 minutes in greased muffin
pans.

HOUSEHOLD KNOWLEDGE.

In cooking a cereal in a double boil-
er, much of it adheres to the side of
the boiler. After you have scraped out
all you can, fill with cold water cover,
and set back on the stove in the lower
part of the boiler to steam for some
time, then turn the water through the
strainer, and what remains of the cer-
eal save to thicken gravy with.

To prevent long sleeves from getting
soiled in the preparation of meals, put
on the little rubber bands that come
for library use and keep the sleeves
out of the way.

Instead of an unsightly knot at the
beginning of sewing, make a button-
hole stitch, also when sewing on but-
tons and mending gloves.

A WAY TO SAVE COAL.

Save all tins used in the house, such
as tomato, corn cans, etc., and when
fixing the fire for the night fill two or
more of the cans with fine coal or
coal dust and place on top of the fire
in such a way that the open ends meet.
The contents of the cans will burn a
long time and the tin will be re-
duced to scraps. This idea can be
used equally well in furnace heating
stove or kitchen range.

Quebec, May 11.—With thousands of
cheering enthusiasts to see her leave
the ways, the first vessel built in close
to half a century on the banks of the
St. Charles river, took to the water
shortly after 7 p.m. at the shipyards
of the Quinlan & Robertson Company
in Le Moliou ward.

She is one of the six vessels that
were under construction for the Im-
perial Board and indications are that
more wood vessels will shortly be con-
structed at Le Moliou. The vessel is
of wood, steam propelled and has a
length over all of 250 feet, with a
beam of 43.6 feet.
