Smelts Saute.

Take one pound of smelts, cleaned and mashed, then roll in flour. Take sauce pan, put in about a quarter of a pound of butter, and when the butter is warm, put in the smelts and a little sage, salt and pepper. Brown nicely on both sides and when done arrange fish in platter with some chopped parsley and juice of one lemon. Pour over all the hot butter the fish was cooked in.

Potato Salad.

Cook potatoes and while they are still hot cut them in dice and cook in slightly salted water. When tender remove the water and mix with French dressing while still hot. Cool and serve with mayonnaise on lettuce.

Rice With Dates.

Prepare the rice by cooking it until tender in a double boiler, allowing a pint each of milk and water to a cup of rice. When thoroughly cooked add a cupful of stoned dates, cooked until tender in a cup of water, and serve cool or just warm.

IT IS WELL TO KNOW

That dampened cigar ashes will clean a brass inkstand.

That machine oil may be removed from white goods by rubbing the spot with chalk, then rubbing it off in a few minutes.

That aluminum dishes can be cleaned on the inside by boiling the skins and bits of discarded tomato in them.

That a grease spot on a leather chair can be removed by applying the beaten white of an egg and letting it dry in the sun.

That a slimy sponge can be cleaned by soaking it in strong borax water, then wring out and renew the water in a little while.

That if you put a little vinegar into the water in which you boil fish, the fish will hold together more firmly.

That if you rub a little flour over the top of a cake before frosting, the frosting will not run down on the sides of the cake.

That a pinch of cream of tartar added to the whites of eggs when whipping them will keep them from falling.
