



NOTICE TO SOLDIERS ON HARVEST LEAVE.

Attention is directed to a recent announcement published in the Press by the Military Service Branch, Department of Justice, regarding extensions to be granted to men EXEMPTED AS FARMERS.

It is pointed out that this DOES NOT IN ANY WAY AFFECT MEN WHO HAVE BEEN ORDERED BY THE REGISTRAR TO REPORT to Depot Battalions and who have thereafter received leave of absence from the Military Authorities.

Once a man has been ordered to report for duty by the Registrar he leaves the jurisdiction of the Registrar and comes under that of the Department of Militia and Defence, and is to be considered as a soldier. This applies to men of the 20 to 22 Class who have been ordered to report by the Registrar in virtue of the cancellation of exemptions by Order-in-Council of the 20th April last, as well as to those ordered to report in the usual way on refusal of claim for exemption, or on expiration of exemption granted.

All men, accordingly, who have been ordered to report, and are therefore SOLDIERS, and who have subsequently been granted harvest leave by the military authorities, MUST, NOTWITHSTANDING THE NOTICE ABOVE REFERRED TO, REPORT ON THE EXPIRATION OF THAT LEAVE, unless they are notified to the contrary by their Commanding Officer or by general notice published by the Department of Militia and Defence.

DESIGN FOR NEW VICTORY BOND BEING MADE

On account of the attractive features of the 1918 Victory Loan it is expected that the number of investors will largely exceed that of last year's Loan, when \$20,000 people contributed to finance Canada's part in the war. The objective this year is a million applicants for bonds and there seems to be good reason to believe that number will be exceeded. Last year 1,800,000 bonds were printed. This year, to meet the demand that is sure to ensue the presses of the American Bank Note Co., at Ottawa will turn out 2,500,000 bonds.

In the making of bonds between 250 and 300 skilled workmen and women are employed. It is work of a highly technical nature, requiring the most elaborate precautions against fraud, and the slightest variation from "form" would weaken the security of the people. Three months are required in the many intricate processes of manufacture. When these are completed the presses begin work and 30,000 bonds are delivered to the Finance Minister every day.

Sending Produce Overseas

The design of the bond and coupon is distinctly Canadian in conception. In the top centre is reproduced a scene that illustrates one of the important features of the new loan, namely the financing of the sales of products to Great Britain and her Allies. The scene is that of a ship at the dock loading products for Great Britain. Then on the coupon, there is a splendid reproduction of Bernard Partridge's famous drawing, "Canada at Ypres" in the Spring of 1915. There are two classes of bonds. Five and fifteen years; with ten and thirty coupons respectively; whereas last year there were three maturing periods, five, ten and twenty years. In colors the bonds are: \$50, blue; \$100, green; \$500, bonds are one-half those of last year, paper.

HEARST GOVT. LOST SEAT IN MANITOULIN

Toronto, Oct. 25.—In the hearts of the Conservative Government of Ontario there is sadness today. If they could they would, no doubt, order the flags on all public buildings to be half-masted, and all because the returns received from Manitoulin Island, with the exception of a few polls, show that the aforesaid Government has sustained a bump. Benjamin Bowman, candidate of the United Farmers of Ontario, and a Mennonite, defeated B. H. Turner, the Conservative nominee in the by-election yesterday, caused through the death of Robert R. Gamey by 290 at last accounts. It is not thought possible that the remaining polls can change the result—indeed one report says that there are only two polls to hear from. Thus it would appear that the Government's panic of a few days ago was justified. Sir William Hearst, who was rushed to the scene for the last two days of the contest, could not stem the tide any more than could his doughty lieutenants, Hon. F. G. MacDermid and Hon. T. W. McGarry, the whirlwind speaker of Ontario politics.

It is said that the election was fought in a considerable degree on the action of the Unoin Government in conscripting the sons of farmers, and that this feeling, combined with the Mennonite vote, which is reported to be strong, carried the day.

The riding had been Conservative for fifteen years.

Obviously the result will be a great filip for the United Farmers of Ontario, who are in politics as an organization to the hilt, and claim that they will have many candidates in the field. In the meantime, they are said to be meeting some success in the raising of funds for a daily paper to be devoted to the interests of farmers. Primarily it could be added that officially, Liberalism kept out of the Manitoulin fight having decided to keep political truce, though, no doubt, many Liberals welcomed the chance to vote for a man of their own persuasion who ran under another banner. The vote was light, according to the reports, owing to a heavy rain. The Ontario Government should be benefited by the result if it is wise. It has a big majority, but a reminder that it is not all powerful, will not do any harm.

NO TIME TO WAVER

"It is possible that Germany's peace offensive may cause wavering, not among our gallant armies, but among our civilian population. Who can tell what the effect on the world would be of a great oversubscription in the approaching Victory Loan campaign in Canada? "The watchword, therefore, for the Victory Loan organization and for the Canadian people until unconditional surrender by the foe is an accomplished fact is not to relax but to redouble every effort.

"There is this further consideration that supposing peace could be declared tomorrow, on terms satisfactory to the allies, Canada's war expenditure would continue for at least another twelvemonth, and consequently the necessity for raising the full amount of the loan would be none the less urgent."
