(Canadian Press direct wire.) New York, Feb. 11. - The workers American Federation of Labor. The of Great Britain and the United States through their spokesmen at a great loyalty mass meeting at the Century Theatre last night, pledged their unit ed unswerving effort to the defeat of Germany. The workers of the United States spoke through Secretary of Labor W. B. Wilson and officials of the workers of Great Britain spoke through Charles Duncan, M. P., head of the British labor mission which arrived in this country yesterday. Pacifists were pilloried by the speakers and when Hugh Frayne, rerpesentative of labor on the war industries board, asked that firing squads be can,

ed to deal with the kaiser-branded seeker after peace-he was cheered to the echo

Secretary Wilson made a special speech to these labor factions which revel in calling this war capitalistic He said it was a war for the common people and not for capitalists.

When to Talk Peace.

Mr. Duncan drew great applaus when he told how the speeches of President Wilson had cried up the people of ESngland. He told of the effect of the coming of American troops in England. Referring to the pacifists Mr. Duncan said:

"It will be time enough to talk about peace when those who started the war ask for peace."

The members of the British delegation besides Mr. Duncan are W. Appleton, secretary general of the Federated Trades and Unions; Joshua Butterworth, Associated Shipwrights' Society, and J. L. Moses, of the Pat tern Workers' Union. Mr. Duncan is geenral secretary of the General Workers' Union and Labor member of parliament for Barrow and Furness.


