THE COLD PACK METHOD.

One of the Easiest and Safest Plans for Conserving Fruits and Vegetables.

It is important that all utensils be clean. No withered or unsound vegetables or fruit should be canned. If possible only fruits or vegetables picked the day of canning should be used. Peas and corn, which lose their flavor rapidly, should be canned within five hours if a choice product is desired. The products to be canned should be blanched by being placed in cheesecloth bag or dipping basket into boiling water and allowed to remain from

As soon as the product is taken from the boiling water it should be dipped into cold water and removed immediately and drained for several minutes. The water used for this purpose should be as cold as possible.

one to fifteen minutes, depending on

the kind of product.

After draining, the product should be placed in hot jars at once. When canning fruits, boiling hot syrup or hot water is added. For vegetables hot water is usually used and salt is added for seasoning. The rubbers and tops, after a thorough scalding in hot water, are placed on the jars sealed. The jars are then placed in the hot water bath.

For this purpose a wash boiler can be used by placing something in the bottom so the jars are not resting directly on the bottom of the boiler.

It is important that the jars be put beans the processing period lasts two hours; for beets one and a half hours carrots, one and a half hours; peas two hours; tomatoes, 22 minutes; sweet potatoes one and a half hours; pumpkins or squash, one hour; corn three and a half hours. To each quart of the vegetables mentioned a table spoonful of salt should be added.

The jars should be sealed while the products are hot, and be placed in a tray upside down to cool, and watched for leaks. If any leakage is discover ed, the tops should be tightened until completely airtight. If air is allowed to get in the fruit or vegetable will All orders receive careful
