Furnished by the local Food Con-
trol Committee.

Indian Pudding.

4 cups milk,
¾ cup cornmeal,
Onethird cup molasses
¾ teaspoon salt,
¾ teaspoon ginger.

Cool the milk and the meal in dou-
ble boiler for twenty minutes; add the
molasses, salt and ginger. Pour into
greased pudding dish and bake two
hours in a slow oven. Serve with
top milk. This amount serves six per-
sons.

Lima Beans Hollandaise.

Dry lima beans, 1½ cup
Crisco, 2 tablespoons,
Butterine, 2 tablespoons,
Lemon juice, 1 tablespoon,
Paprika, half teaspoon,
Bean stock, half cup,
Egg yolks, two.
Parsley, chopped, 1 tablespoon,
Salt, 1 teaspoon,
Pepper, ¼ teaspoon.

Soak beans, cook until tender, add
salt while cooking; cream butter and
crisco in double boiler; add egg yolks,
chopped parsley, lemon juice, paprika.
Beat well and add bean stock. Add
beans and stir over boiling water un-
til the sauce thickens.
