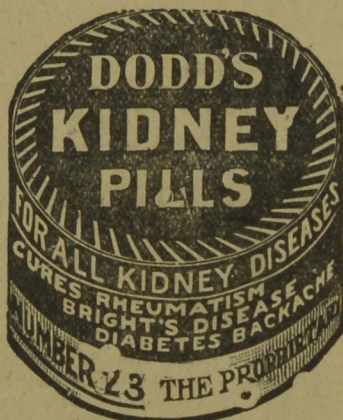

they did not regard the New World as the best place in which to start their son, so they took him home to "Bonnie Scotland" where he remained until he was twelve years old. It was there that he got the rudiments of his education.



At the advanced age of thirteen years Robert served as timekeeper in the business of his father, George Bruce Low, a sterling Scotsman, one of the first, if not the first of building contractors in Halifax, to popularize concrete for house building purposes. For five years, 1889-1894, he was assistant superintendent of the same business before crossing into the United States where he spent a year or so getting added experience in the line he had decided to follow.

But Halifax had an attraction for the boy, now a young man in the early twenties, so he returned and held the position of superintendent of his father's business for three years. The spirit of adventure was strong in him, so at the end of that period he went into business himself in Sydney, the firm name being McManus, Low and McManus. Later on he was a member, having risen then to senior partner, of the firm of Low, McManus & Horne, which name was again changed to the R. S. Low Contracting Company and continued to do business under that name until 1910. His present partnership known as Bate, McMahon & Co., General Contractors, Ottawa, was formed in 1912.

A Household Word.

Many of the big contracting jobs of the Dominion, whether public or private enterprise, have been undertaken or assisted by Colonel Low, but he became a truly national figure and his name a household word in Canada after the war opened. Peaceful Canada had no military training camp when she threw herself and her resources in the great fight for liberty and justice. But she soon had them. Valcartier Camp was constructed in record time, and was followed by Camp Hughes, Sarcee Camp and Camp Borden under Low's direction. The fortifications at Halifax was another job which "Colonel Bob" handled, and he was engaged in constructing hangars, barracks, etc., for the Aviation Department of the Imperial Munitions Board, or Schools for training aviators, when the terrible blow

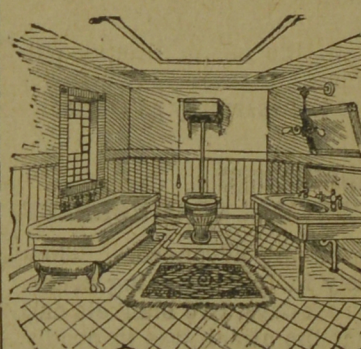
Oats will be sold for \$1.32 per bushel, in bulk car lots, or \$1.38 in bags in car lots laid down.

Wheat will be sold for \$3.00 per bushel, in bags car lots or f. o. b., distributing point for smaller orders.

Local freights will be paid by purchaser. County Councillors and Agricultural Societies should place car lot orders immediately, stating destination for cars. Delivery not guaranteed unless orders placed within three weeks, because of transportation difficulties.
