THE SUPPLY OF POULTRY SHOULD BE INCREASED

No Class of Farm Stock Reproduced at a Greater Rate---An Economical Meat Producer Which Gives Large Returns---New Brunswick Farmers Should Maintain Much Larger Flocks.

(By A. C. McCulloch, Provincial Poultry Superintendent.)

Numerous reasons may be advanced for the production of a greatly increased supply of poultry as a war-time measure but due to the present condi-

tion of the livestock situation two reasons become increasingly important.

1. Of all classes of farm stock poultry reproduces at the greatest rate, and in a comparatively short time.

2. Poultry is an economical meat producer, giving large returns for proper food.

The country needs meat and needs it quickly. A pen of 20 hens should in the regular hatching season lay at least one dozen suitable eggs daily which if continued for six weeks means a total of over 300 eggs. If these are incubated and the chicks raised at maturity there should be at the end of six months at least 200 fine market chickens, 1,000 per cent. of the original flock. The number may be considerably increased by extending the hatching season which, though of doubtful value in the production of heavy winter laying pullets, may be done for the production of market poultry.

As to the economy of production there is no doubt. Poultry requires concentrated food of both vegetable and animal origin but it has remarkable ability for the utilization of the same in flesh and egg production. On the farm a good sized flock can be raised at comparatively little expense.

Size of Flock.

The average farm in New Brunswick should support one to two hens per acre or 1-00 to 200 head of laying stock per 100 acres. This is in striking contrast to the 20 to 40 adult birds at present maintained on most farms. A flock of 200 laying birds can and will yield a large profit if given good

Under the Variety

Obtain a few good females and a good male of a good variety and breed from these, or obtain eggs from a good flock of a good variety for hatching purposes. In either case use the new flock as a foundation for a new pure bred flock. In addition select a few of the best utility females from the flock and mate to the best male obtainable. Hatch from these but sell the offspring as market poultry.

Flock of Crosses or Mongrels.

Adopt the same plan as with the flock of purebreds of undesirable variety.

Under all conditions when obtaining birds or eggs for breeding purposes insist on their coming from flocks or strains which have been bred for high egg production, vigor and market qualities—good utility chickens.

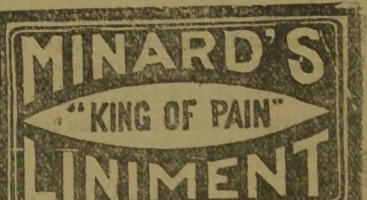
