

1¼ cups graham flour, 1 cup white flour, 1 cup sour milk, One-third cup molasses ¼ teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon salt.

Sift and mix the dry ingredients; dd milk to molasses; combine mixures and bake in a hot oven. Tested by Mrs. G. W. Hodge
