PROF. FISHER ON PROHIBITION

Boston, Mar. 3. — The advantages of prohibition as a factor in winning the war were discussed at a conference on "the social significance of alcohol," conducted under the direction of the league for preventive work and participated in by many social workers from many parts of the state.

Professor Irving Fisher of Yale, one of the speakers, whose subject was "War-time Prohibition," said:

"The time honored and most effective argument for the liquor traffic is that it makes large contributions to the revenue of the nation, state and city. At first blush, the war seems to increase the force of this argument. The war increases the need of revenue but the government revenues come out of the national dividend of produced goods and the liquor traffic does not add to but on the contrary, subtracts from that dividend. Prohibition would not reduce the volume of taxable goods, but it would simply substitute other goods than liquor—such, for instance, as soft drinks, candy, foods and clothing, which otherwise would never have been produced at all."

"Prohibition, by keeping sober say a hundred thousand men now incapacitated each day by drunkenness and by increasing the productive power of those who, while not drunk, are slowed down by alcohol, would speed up production at least ten per cent, which, if applied to the more than half of our national dividend now produced in 'wet' territory, would add over two millions to our national dividend. It follows that more than two billions now spent on alcohol and the more than two billions of national income which prohibition would bring could all be paid in taxes without making the people one cent poorer. They would pay for one-fifth of the war cost."

BIG TIMBER FOR WOODEN SHIPS

Washington, D. C., Feb. 28. — To accomplish more rapid delivery of southern pine timber for shipbuilding operations, the Emergency Fleet Corporation is putting logging experts in the forests to assist in locating trees for the heavier lumber.

So slow has been the delivery of the heavier timbers that the corporation is obtaining from the Pacific coast 3,000 cars of fir lumber for use in eastern and southern yards. The wooden building program, it was declared today, is at least three months behind schedule, and with little hope of catching up.

Shipbuilding contracts held by two southern concerns have been cancelled by the corporation on the ground that the ships were not being built. One for the construction of 15 vessels was held by the Southern Shipbuilding Company at Charleston, S. C., and the other for eight ships by the Hampton Shipbuilding Company at Norfolk.

On the Pacific coast both wooden and steel construction is proceeding at a much more satisfactory rate than along the Atlantic and Gulf. One plant at Seattle launched a steel ship yesterday and turned over to the Fleet Corporation another complete.
