GERMANS SIGN A PEACE AGREEMENT WITH RUSSIA

Officially Announced at Berlin that Military Movements in Great Russia Have Ceased ---All German Peace Conditions Have Been Accepted by the Russians---German Socialists Not Satisfied with Peace Conditions.

Berlin, via London, Mar. 3. — "By reason of the signing of the peace treaty with Russia," says the official communication from headquarters tonight, "military movements in Great Russia have ceased."

Amsterdam, Mar. 3. — According to the Vossische Zeitung of Berlin, the peace negotiations at Bucharest, Roumania, have failed. It is understood that King Ferdinand's reply to the Central Powers was unsatisfactory.

The Germans in their advance through Russia have captured, according to the official communication from general headquarters, 6,800 officers and 57,000 men; 2,400 guns, 5,000 machine guns, thousands of motor vehicles, 800 locomotives and thousands of railroad trucks.

A Craven Surrender.

Petrograd, Mar. 2. — in the fear that argument would result in even more onerous terms, the Russian delegation at Brest-Litovsk has accepted

all the German peace conditions and is about to sign an agreement, according to a telegram from the delegates received today at the Smolny Institute. The demands already have been increased, they reported. The message, which was addressed to Premier Lenin and Foreign Minister Trotsky, follows:

"As we anticipated, deliberations on a treaty of peace are absolutely useless and could only make things worse in comparison with the ultimatum of February 21. They might even assume the character of leading to the presentation of another ultimatum."

"In view of this fact and in consequence of the Germans' refusal to cease military action until peace is signed, we have resolved to sign the treaty without discussing its contents and leave after attaching our signatures. We therefore have requested a train, expecting to sign today and leave afterwards."

The most serious feature of the new demands compared with those of February 21, is the following: "To detach the regions of Karabagh, Kars and Batoum from Russian territory on the pretext of the right of peoples to self-determination."

Turkey was the beneficiary of these changes in the peace terms. The new demands included that Russia relinquish the regions of Batoum, Kars and Karabagh (Karabagh) to the Turks. These regions are in Transcaucasia and make a considerable addition to the Sultan's dominions in that section of the world.

While it is understood that all the Teutonic allies have signed the formal treaty ending the war with Russia, it is said that the economic and legal phases of resuming peaceful relations will be taking up individually by each country.

Trouble in Reichstag.

The German Socialists have bitterly attacked the peace treaty with Russia. In a debate in the Reichstag there were charges that Germany and Austria are already quarreling over the spoils of war and that the real truth of the situation in the east is being kept from the German public.

While Berlin says that the German invasion has ceased, Austrian forces have occupied three more towns in Ukraine and have captured three divisions of Russian infantry as well as the staffs of two Russian corps.

WOMAN KILLED IN AUTO RACE

Stockton, Cal., Mar. 3. — Nina Vitagliana, Los Angeles, was killed here today when a tire flew off her car during a woman's automobile race. Five others were injured. One of these, her mechanic, R. Niverry, sustained a fractured skull. Miss Vitagliana was racing against Ruth Wighman when her machine shot through a fence.
