SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Oatmeal Bannocks.

A good hot weather cake on summer venings with ripe berries or other ool fruits is fresh oatmeal bannock To make, add a half teaspoonful of salt to 21/2 cupfuls of oatmeal. Mix into the oatmeal 2 tablespoonfuls of melted vegetable fat; mix with a silver knife and add slowly a teaspoonful at a time enough mixed milk and water to form a stiff paste. Divide the paste in 3 or 4 portions and knead each piece. Roll out in cakes 1/4 inch thick and bake in greased pans in moderate oven. Serve hot with butter and fresh fruit.

With Chateau-Thierry evacuated by the Ger mans during the previous night, the town was entirely carried by an Allied Paris, July 22.- Violent storms in advance in the region to the north, France have caused severe damage to while from the west Franco-American were crowding in upon the Germans Between the Ourcq and the Marne the enemy was attacked by detachments under General Mitry, which had cross ed the Marne. The general result was that the Germans were thrown back from eight to ten kilometres on the Chateau-Thierry front.
