He was asked concerning the changes to be expected. "The war will bring many changes to England," he replied. "But we must go slowly. Thing will never be quite the same again."

**PLAIN TALK TO THE HUNS FROM A FRENCH GENERAL**

(New York Herald)

The Germans have become callous to the world's opinion and accept the epithets Boche and Hun without protest or apparent shame. But some of them may have felt compunctious twinges when they heard or read the remarks of General Fayolle on the occasion of the entry of French troops into Mayence last Saturday. He uttered them within the former palace of the Duke of Hesse, and his hearers were the burghers and official representatives of the city.

General Fayolle told the German burghers that the war which their country had forced upon France was the most unjust and cruel humanity had ever known and described with dramatic emphasis, such as a French orator knows so well how to employ, some of the foul and wicked things which their generals and armies had done both in France and Belgium; how they had ravaged and laid waste village after village and town after town by fire and sword, and then acted like common thieves carrying off to Germany household linen, furniture, treasures of antiquity jewels, tools, machinery—anything on which they could lay their hands.

"That is not war," said General Fayolle, "it is robbery by armed forces. Today in our country there are thousands of families homeless and without resources. Their land has been turned into a desert. That is the situation which the iniquity of your war has created and for which you will remain responsible. You have made terrorism a system of war." And then

the general told them how such deeds had only hardened the spirit of resistance and hastened the victory of the French and their allies. He described to them the defeats of the German armies since July 15, the capture of thousands of guns, hundreds of thousands of prisoners and endless supplies until the German army was shattered and had to beg for an armistice in order to avoid complete disaster.

The final sting in General Fayolle's remarks was when he told the German burghers that, while the French could not forget the wrongs inflicted on them by Germany, they would never make women and children responsible for them or destroy for the mere pleasure of causing damage, and that so long as they accepted loyally the conditions imposed by General Mangin commanding the Tenth Army in Mayence, they need not fear for their persons or goods. The Germans may think themselves lucky to have in their midst foreign forces, representing people who are faithful to the principles of justice and humanity. May they profit by the example.

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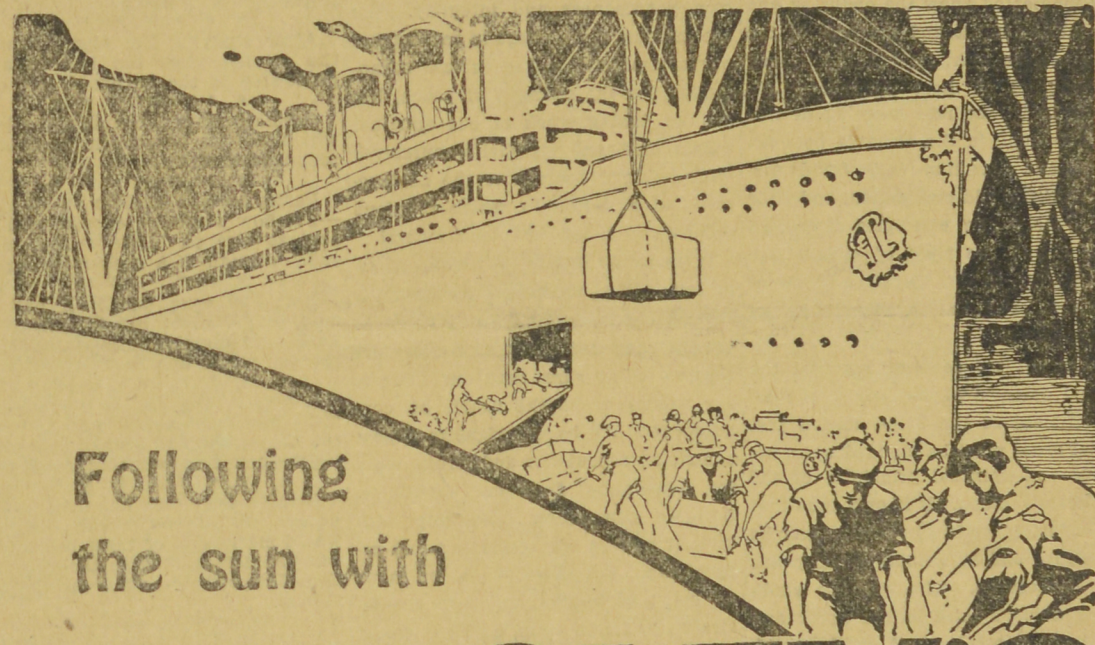
