TELLS OF TROUBLE BETWEEN RUSSIANS AND ROUMANIANS

Bessarabian Officials Sought Vainly to Induce the Roumanians to Put a Stop to Looting and Restore Order---Russians Attacked a Town with great energy and Roumanians Saved it From Destruction.

London, Jan. 30. — The reasons which led to the invasion of Bessarabia by Roumanian troops, one of the causes of the rupture in relations between Roumania and Russia are explained by the correspondent of the Times, with the Roumanian army, in a despatch dated January 22. He says the Bessarabian officials made repeated appeals to the Roumanians to restore order and save private property from looters, conditions having been greatly disturbed by the Bolshevik regiment. Another and more powerful consideration was that Bessarabia contained all manner of supplies belonging to Roumania, which the Bolsheviks threatened to destroy.

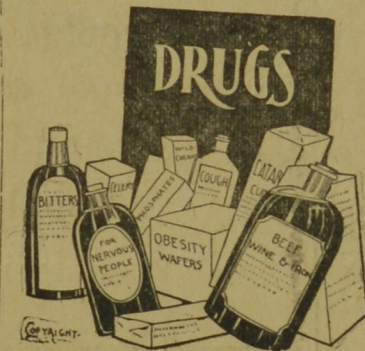
Absolute Isolation.
To save these stores and maintain communication with Odessa and Kiev was, the correspondent says, a matter

of life or death involving the question of Roumania's absolute isolation from her allies in western Europe.

Describing the fight between Russians and Roumanians in Galatz, the correspondent says but for the valor of the Roumanians the town would have been reduced to a mass of ruins. The Russians attacked the town with great energy on January 21. The Roumanians resisted stubbornly, but the situation became critical. Eventually the Roumanians gained the victory by a counter attack with bayonets and hand grenades, aided by fire of two small gunboats at the mouth of the Sereth river.

An Exchange Telegraph despatch from Petrograd says the Russian commission have ordered the removal of M. Koseovsky, chairman of the revolutionary inquiry commission, and some of his colleagues on the charge of bribery. They have appointed new members and ordered a careful investigation. The affair has caused a great disturbance in Petrograd.
