
R. YOUNG DISCUSSES

Following is the synoptic report of the speech delivered in the Legislature a few days ago by Mr. John A.

Young, one of the members for York:

MR. YOUNG said the financial situation had been dealt with fully by the Hon. Provincial Secretary. If the picture of this province's financial condition was as black as he had painted it. it was time the members of the government got together and made a determined effort to raise the province out of the slough.
