MR. MURRAY WITHDRAWS WOMAN SUFFRAGE BILL

Opposition Leader in the House Tried to Assume Prerogatives Belonging to the Crown---Withdrew Bill When Told that Lieutenant Governor had been Advised to Withhold Assent From It.

The Legislature resumed last evening after the week-end adjournment, with nearly all the members present. The Speaker decided in favor of the point of order raised by Hon. C. W. Robinson on Mr. Murray's motion with respect to the patriotic tax bill, but at the request of the opposition leader decided to take the matter into further consideration. The Speaker decided that the opposition leader's woman suffrage bill was in order and the bill was introduced, but was withdrawn at the request of Premier Foster, who stated that he had advised the Lieutenant Governor to withhold his assent from it.

The debate on the budget was continued by Mr. Pinder of York and Mr. Magee of Westmorland. Mr. Potts of St. John moved the adjournment of the debate.

Assembly Chamber,

April 15, 1918.

The House met at 8.30 o'clock p.m. HON. MR. SPEAKER said he would give his decision on the point of order raised by Hon. Mr. Robinson to the motion of Mr. Murray (Kings) that bill No. 47 be referred back to the committee of the whole House. He said that while it had been the custom in the House to convey instructions to the committee when referring a bill back for further consideration, he had found on consulting Bourinot that the practice was irregular and out of order; he would therefore rule the motion of the hon. member for Kings out of order.

MR. MURRAY (Kings) said that he had been a member of the House for eleven sessions, and it had always been the custom during that time for the Speaker to receive a motion of the kind that he (Murray) had made. He

knew that this had been done in the past, with the approval of the hon. member from Moncton, when he had been an occupant of the Speaker's chair, and the journals of the House would support him in that. In view of the fact that he had only followed the usual custom with respect to a motion of the kind he had made, he would be obliged to appeal to the House from the ruling of the chair.

MR. BAXTER contended that the ruling cited by Hon. Mr. Speaker was applicable only to bills going before the House in the committee stage, and not to a bill which was up for its third reading. He contended that instructions to a committee could not be considered in the nature of an amendment and that the ruling which the chair had given was altogether contrary to Bourinot.

HON. MR. SPEAKER said that he had not read the particular rule cited by the hon. member for St. John, but had only looked up the rules which had
