HOW GERMAN ADVANCE HIT REBUILT FRANCE

The Rush From Reconstructed
Villages as the Devastating
German Hordes Came
on Again.

(New York Sun.)

The havoc, devastation and suffering which with the start of the German offensive burst again on the little rebuilt villages of Picardy, just settled once more in the peaceful ways of home, are described in a letter received by the American Committee for Devastated France from Mrs. Anne Dike.

Her letter is the first to reach the United States with the story of the evacuation of the French villages under the pressure of the German guns. It gives a vivid recital of one of the saddest phases of the war.

Peace Seemed Possible.

"For the first three weeks of March," she writes, "we lived on the quiet for the German offensive, but as the days prolonged into weeks we somehow began to accept the idea that the peace talkers were right—then suddenly came the catastrophe.

"On Wednesday night at 10 o'clock we heard the barrage within a few miles. For several days we had had heavy fog night and morning, with a clear sky at noon, and undoubtedly the Germans had made all their observations, and under cover of the fog brought their men and guns into positions. The next morning the guns were so near and the rumors so disturbing, we decided to go into that region where we had several small villages under our protection and help in the evacuation of the civilians.

"We got out all the children first and brought them to our dispensary. Later the parents came to the chateau for refuge. We had meals to prepare luggage to sort, all the children of these and other villages to care for; then suddenly began the quick evacuation of other villages than our own, and we were swamped with work. It was harrowing. It was time to send off some of our older refugees.

Parents Leave Children.

"Then an extraordinary thing happened. The parents asked us to keep their children. Such a mark of confidence has probably never been given before. It was a big responsibility—I could not have believed that the French women would consent to be separated from their babies, but they had all known the horrors of a previous evacuation, and they trusted to us to save their children another such experience.

Red Cross Cars Arrive.

"About midnight the Red Cross cars arrived. We rapidly put into them some of the valuable stores we knew might be required—soup, milk, flour and sugar especially, also blankets and mattresses. We did not know what to expect. It was a wild night; the Germans were reported as coming, and coming fast. Were the French and English holding? Would our beloved centre fall into the hands of the enemy? We could not think; we had to work, and we did until morning.

"Then came a sudden call from the French headquarters asking the last two members to move a little further back, but to wait there until further orders. We were reassured that the great French army had stemmed the advance in our direction, but that we must move.

"In the last few days events have taken a better turn. We are optimistic we are hopeful, we believe and want to believe the hideous waves of German hordes have been stopped. We are here to help—that is all we know and care."

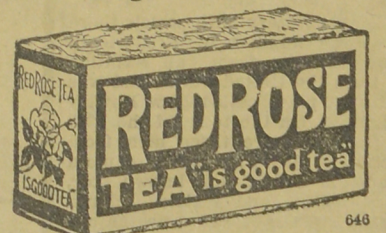
