

The same age limits and other conditions affecting British and Canadian subjects in their home countries, will be applied to those in the United States, making all natives of the United Kingdom who are between the ages of 20 and 40 years eligible, but subject to the same exemption rights as men living in England or Canada.

"This is a perfectly fair arrange ment," said General White in his telegraphic instructions, "for it compels every man who claims British citizenship to place himself on practically the same footing as his fellow-countrymen at home.'

According to General White, British subjects will be given 60 days after enactment of the reciprocal draft measure to join the English forces voluntarily. It is during this period that the Mission plans to launch a nation-wide campaign.
