MR. GOMPERS PRAISES THE CANADIANS

Boston, Mass., May 1—A solemn warning to organized workers of the United States against the unwarranted stopping of work or entering into any movement which "you cannot defend when your boys return from the trenches," was sounded by Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, addressing a patriotic mass meeting in Faneuil Hall. Mr. Gompers stated he had just come from Canada where he found the people "as true as steel and determined to fight side by side with the men of the mother country. They welcome our whole hearted support," he stated.

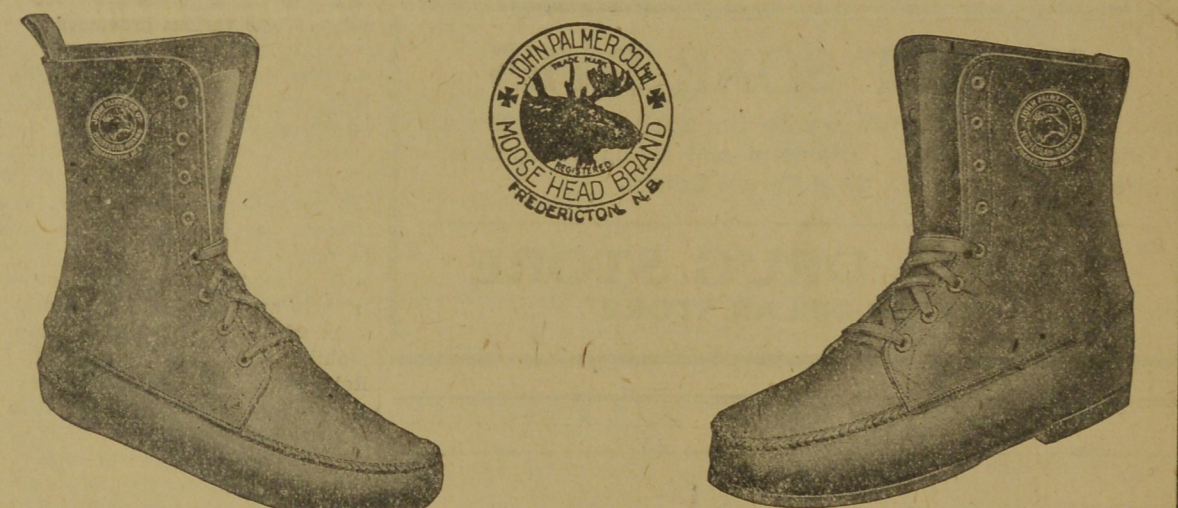
