SOME MARMALADES

Orange Marmalade.

5 oranges, 2 lemons, cold water and
sugar.

Wash and slice fruit very thin with-
out peeling. Discard thick ends and
seeds. To each pound of sliced fruit
add three pints of cold water and let
stand twenty-four hours. Then boil
forty-five minutes hard, counting the
time from the beginning of boiling.
Let stand 24 hours again. Weigh and
add pound for pound of sugar. Add
lemon juice if fruit is not sufficiently
tart. Boil as above. Pour into glass
jars and seal. Stir occasionally dur-
ing first boiling and more frequently
during the second boiling, as mater-
ial is apt to burn.

Grapefruit Marmalade.

1 orange, 1 lemon, 1 grapefruit, cold
water, sugar.

Proceed as with orange marmalade.
Will make eight or ten glasses.

Rhubarb Marmalade.

4½ lbs. rhubarb, 5 oranges, juice
only, and grated rind of three of them,
¾ lbs. sugar.

Wash, peel and cut rhubarb into 2-
inch lengths, put all ingredients to-
gether and let stand 24 hours. Boil
one and a half hours, pour into glass
jars and seal.

Apricot and Apple Marmalade.

1 lb. dried apricots, 1 qt. of apple
sauce, ¾ cups of sugar and the juice
of one orange.

Wash the apricots thoroughly, cover
with hot water and soak overnight.
Make a quart of smooth apple sauce.
Rub the softened apricots through a
sieve to remove fibres and stir the
pulp, sauce, sugar and orange juice
thoroughly together. Cook very slowly
with asbestos under the kettle to
prevent scorching. About forty-five
minutes will be required. Pour into
sterilized glasses and seal.

peal for Good Conduct.

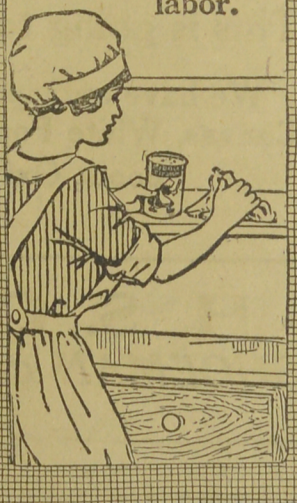
Baltimore, Md., May 2.—A stirring
