THE FISHERY COMMISSION AT BOSTON

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

Boston, Jan. 31.—Long disputed questions regarding the fisheries along the coasts of New England and the Canadian Maritime Provinces and in the border waters of Lake Champlain came before an international conference here today for a thorough ironing out. The Canadian fisheries mission was headed by Chief Justice J. D. Hazen of New Brunswick, who was accompanied by William A. Found, Dominion superintendent of fisheries, and Arnold Roberts, first secretary of the British embassy at Washington. Secretary of Commerce William G. Redfield, assistant secretary Edwin F. Sweet, and Hugh M. Smith, Chief of the Bureau of Fisheries, comprised the American delegation.
