#### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

##### CLEANING HINTS.

Some Reliable Information That May  
Have Been Heard Before and Per-  
haps Forgotten.

Quite the very best thing to use on  
white paint, first, last and always, is  
just plain cold water, no soap, noth-  
ing else.

A sooty kitchen ceiling will yield to  
two parts warm water and one part  
sweet milk. If the ceiling be white,  
then brushing over with a dry white  
shoe dressing will restore it effectually.

If you would eliminate any possibili-  
ties of blood poisoning, don't use shot  
to clean decanters or bottles. A little  
soapy water and some fine sand make  
a much safer cleanser.

Are you in doubt about the right  
way to clean oil paintings? Half a  
raw potato rubbed quickly over the  
canvas is a reliable method. Finish  
by polishing the surface with a silk  
handkerchief.

Linoleum if wiped first with a cloth  
dipped in warm water, then wrung  
dry, and finally wiped over with skim-  
med milk, retains its original bright-  
ness to a surprising degree.

Raw potato makes an excellent re-  
mover of mud stains from dark cloth.

If you would keep your piano keys  
clean and white, moisten a piece of  
muslin with alcohol and rub over the  
keys. Even better for the removal of  
obstinate soil is a bit of cotton flannel  
wet with cologne water. An excellent  
way to bleach yellowed keys is to sat-  
urate a cloth with a solution of oxalic  
acid; lay it across the keys.

A bit of turpentine on a soft cloth is  
one reliable way to remove stains  
from hardwood floors.

Windows and mirrors give brilliant  
results if treated to a wash of warm  
water in which has been dissolved a  
little turpentine.

##### DAINTY WAISTS.

Never hang silk or lace waists on a  
line to dry. Squeeze dry and fold in  
a bath towel until dry enough to press,  
then press on the wrong side very  
carefully, being sure to keep a good  
shape, as that counts.

##### KID-LINED GLOVES.

Bright colored kid linings are a fea-  
ture of some of the new gloves. Deep  
violet and rose and green, they are.  
Facings, they should more correctly  
be called. The colored part is turned  
back over the outside of white in a  
wide cuff.
