## RECEPTION OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL PROVED HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL SOCIAL EVENT

Address on Behalf of the People of the Province Read by Premier Foster—Reply by Duke of Devonshire—Enjoyable Dance Followed the Presentation of Address and the Reception—Supper Served in Legislative Library.

The reception of His Excellency the Duke of Devonshire last night at the Parliament Building with the presentation of an address on behalf of the province by Premier Foster and the dance which followed was one of the most successful social events of the many which the walls of the legislative building have seen. The speech of His Excellency in reply to the address from the province expressed fully the feelings of thankfulness on account of the close of the great war, of pride in the achievements of British arms and confidence in the future which are felt by all.

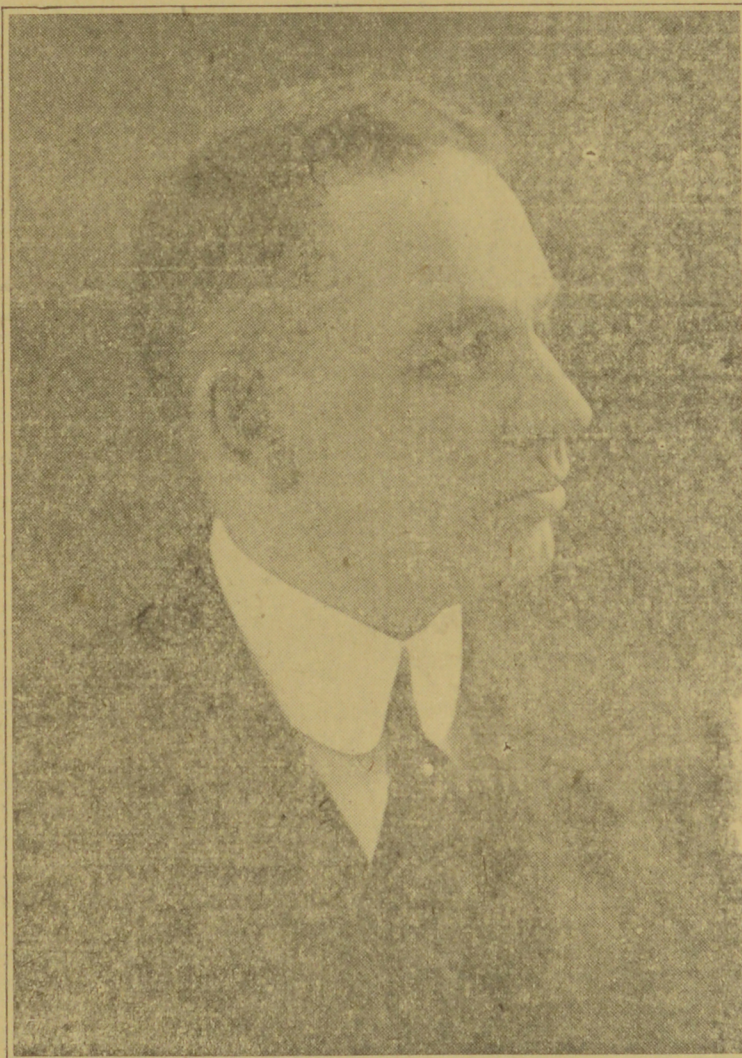
The address was presented to His Excellency in the Assembly Chamber in the presence of a large gathering. The evening dress of the ladies relieved here and there by a khaki uniform and conventional evening dress of the civilian added to the brilliancy of the scene. His Excellency then replied.

The presentation of those desirous of meeting His Excellency also took place in the Assembly Chamber.

A dance program of ten numbers and extras was played by Rowan's orchestra later in the night and refreshments were served from the office of the Engrossing Clerk. Supper was served in the Legislative Library. Tables were set in the alcoves and His Excellency and a party specially invited were first served.

### Address From the Province

The address was as follows:

To His Excellency The Duke of Devonshire, Knight of the most Noble Order of the Garter, One of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of St. Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominion of Canada.

May it Please Your Excellency:

It is with very sincere feelings of loyalty and devotion to our Gracious Sovereign that the people of the Province of New Brunswick extend to you, through its Executive Government a most cordial welcome on this, occasion of your first official visit to the Province.

Your coming among us at this particular time, when our hearts are lifted up in rejoicing and thankfulness for the great victory that has at last crowned the efforts of the British nation in conjunction with its noble Allies over a horrid enemy, adds a special pleasure to the welcome we desire to express to your Excellency.

His Excellency's Reply

In reply to Premier Foster, his Excellency said that he was deeply grateful for the splendid reception accorded him by the citizens of Fredericton. He said it was the greatest moment in our lives after more than four years of anxiety and strife. He dwelt then upon different phases of the war, its horrors and the great good which will now result since victory has dawned upon the world. He spoke of the peace conference and the measures which will be meted out to assure the world against another outbreak of hostilities. He paid a glowing tribute to the men of this province who went forth and took their places in the army, the navy and air forces as well as to the women who built up such great war institutions such as the Red Cross. Above all he said we must look back and admire the glorious courage displayed by all citizens.

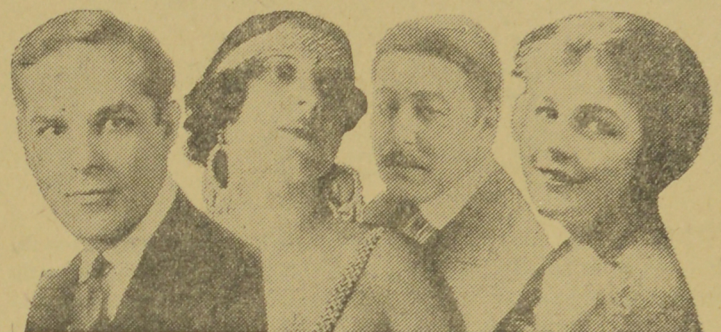
