CARELESS WITH GUN POWDER

Toronto, June 28.—Again the administration of the Royal Air Force here was criticized by a coroner's jury. The jury, presided over by Dr. J. H. Tandy, returned a verdict last night attributing the death of Harry Chapman to great negligence on the part of the military authorities in the storing of powder and allowing troops and public generally to smoke where the same was stored.

COMMITTED SUICIDE AT HALIFAX

 A sad tragedy occurred in the Dominion Police Office in the Eastern Trust Building yesterday afternoon between five o'clock and half-past five o'clock, when James R. Reid of New Glasgow, drew a revolver and shot himself through the heart expiring immediately before the eyes of his wife with whom he had been conversing. Up to a few days ago the deceased man had been a member of the Dominion Police, but had come here in the first place on reconstruction work. The police were informed of the tragedy by Inspector West, and the Medical examiner, Dr. Finn, was called on the scene, after which the body was removed to Snows Undertaking rooms.

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DECLARATION OF FAITH BY LORD SHAUGHNESSY

Canada Has a Permanent Supply of Hydraulic Power Cheaper Than Can be Derived From Coal--It Also Has Railways Ahead of Actual Requirements--Overseas Transportation Will Resume Its Former State of Efficiency.

The Montreal Star of Saturday published the following declaration of faith in Canada's future by Lord Shaughnessy, with an endorsement by hundreds of the leading business concerns of the country:

DECLARATION OF FAITH IN CANADA'S FUTURE.

Our belief in a brilliant future for Canadian manufactures and kindred interests is not inspired by love of country, but by business sentiment. It is founded upon material and psychological facts. We have power—a permanent and all-sufficient supply of hydraulic power, cheaper than can be derived from coal, which indeed, has enriched nations, but is an exhaustible asset. We possess raw materials of which the visible store constantly increases through exploration, while their economic value grows steadily as new discoveries are made in applied science.

Our railways have been spread over the land to the full measure, and, sometimes, in anticipation of actual requirements. The highways are being multiplied and can be fitted to serve for motor truck traffic. The waterways are widely distributed and perfectible. When normal conditions are restored, nothing can prevent our overseas transportation system from resuming its former state of efficiency and promising development.

Thus are the essentials of industrial prosperity at the command of our producers, whose only source of economic weakness lies in the comparative sparseness of our population. But its large increase may confidently be fore-shadowed, because we have land and space. Any reactions in the trend of immigration have been due to outside or general causes, and fortunately have served to facilitate the so-called crucible action of assimilation.

This indeed must be thorough and expedited by education, moral, scientific and technical, so that in our nation may be perpetuated those sterling qualities which tend to overcome the political and sociological difficulties of democracy. In these days of stress, the principle of self-government has been vindicated by us, to the effacement of conflicting interests and racial prejudice.

For all these basic reasons, we may well open our hearts to that gentle spirit of optimism which alone, when controlled by the mind, is conducive to progress.

Peace, although not yet in sight, is a boon, entailing responsibilities for which it is imperative that we make preparation. Having nobly asserted herself as a nation when at war, it behooves Canada to maintain, in the field of industry, a position commensurate with her generous heritage and acquired potency. The opportunity is at hand, in the possibilities of reconstruction.

PASTORS OF FRANCE DOFF CLOTH TO FIGHT

Dr. Reuben Sallens Says That Half of the Protestant Ministers Are at the Front.

Half the Protestant pastors of France are in the trenches, but their work goes on. It is done now by the old men who thought their days of active service in the pulpit were over, and by women.

One of the grey haired religious "home guards" of France is in Chicago today—Dr. Reuben Sallens of Paris, who since the war began has been going from one pastorless parish to another in the south of France preaching and marrying and christening—and all too often burying. The years have drawn kindly lines around his eyes, but the eyes still flash; his speech is slow, like his motions, but he has taken up the work of younger men and is carrying it steadily. And he says many others are doing the same.

Goes From Village to Village

"Half the protestant population of France is in the region around Nimes," he said today as he rested at the Hotel LaSalle before his talk at the Emmanuel Baptist church this evening under the auspices of the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society. "It is old Huguenot country, and whatever of Puritan of austere, still exists in France, is there. And it is there that I have been going from village to village, doing what I can that their own pastors would do.

"Oh these poor villages! Hardly a family that has not been stricken. You know, our families are small in France and if a son is killed it is probable that the family ends with him. They are wonderfully brave, our women. They are not sustained by enthusiasm, as at the beginning of the war—they do not wave flags in the street; the time is past for that. But they do pray and endure. I do not mean that there has been a great spiritual awakening in France—I have not found that—but they turn to religion for comfort.

"No Denominations in War"

"To some extent the work of supplying the empty pulpits is organized and some villages may expect the visit of a substitute pastor with regularity; but many, like myself, go about without instruction other than our own knowledge of the need. I am a Baptist, but I go to all denominations. There are no denominations in war.

"The women also help. I know of cases where pastors write their sermons in the trenches and send them to their wives, who read them in the churches. And the religious work of women among homes is invaluable. My wife and daughter go with me always.

"In the front lines, I know from letters from my friends, there are no atheists. Though a man may have no religion, there he respects and leans upon the religion of those who have. He asks his comrade jokingly to sing a hymn when they are in danger, and he joins in the refrain.

"And it is so in France. Though there is no wave of religious enthusiasm, yet when the heart is softened it is a good time to sow the seed."
