The Canada Registration Board has issued a regulation that every provincial registrar of births and deaths vincial registrar of births and deaths shall transmit at beginning of each month to the central registrar a return of the name, age and place of residence of every person of 16 years or upwards, whose death shall have been notified to him during the preceding month. Also, the number of deaths under 16 years and the number of births during the same period. Any official who refuses or neglects to perform his duty, under these regulations is liable to a fine not exceeding \$100 and imprisonment not exceeding one month.
