London, July 2—An explosion occurred in the National Shell filling factory in the Midlands on Monday night it was officially announced today. Between sixty and seventy persons lost their lives.

TOO MUCH BUSINESS FOR ONE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Basis of Agreement With Town of Devon on Taxation is Reached---Income to be Taxed Where Earned---Bathing Houses to be Built---Sharp Comment re School Board---Meeting Again Tonight

The City Council met last night in committee and in regular session later, but found that the committee meeting had occupied so much time that insufficient time remained for the Council meeting, and an adjournment was made until 8 o'clock tonight.

In committee much business was transacted. The matter of electing three members of the School Board to replace Mrs. W. G. Clark, J. J. Weddall and J. M. Lemont, whose terms have expired, caused an animated exchange of opinion. Some aldermen stated that the School Board had been extravagant. His Worship said the Board had not been extravagant, and that the teachers deserved more salary.

The civic bathing beach was discussed, and with opposition from Ald. Davidson the special committee was empowered to erect two houses suitable for dressing rooms and places for clothing.

The City Hall committee was empowered to call for tenders for a new

heating plant for the City Hall, but with no power to award a contract.

The special committee on the Isolation Hospital was continued.

A basis of agreement with the Town of Devon on the matter of assessment was passed in committee.

School Board.

A communication from the Chief Supt. of Education concerning vacancies on the School Board brought up the matter of school trustees. The three trustees whose terms have expired are Mrs. W. G. Clark, J. J. Weddall and J. M. Lemont. The terms of their successors should end in 1921, 1922 and 1923 respectively, but hitherto the City Council has not made appointments so as to comply with the provision that the term of one trustee shall expire each year.

Ald. McKay remarked that a change would be beneficial, as there was a strong opinion that school expenditures had increased too rapidly and without adequate return.

Mayor Hanson—"You should not be parsimonious with schools."

Ald. Wilkinson—"There has been heavy increase."

Mayor Hanson—"There will be more. I may be considered interested, but I will say that Fredericton has the best principal in the province. The yearly results show that. The little town of Sussex appointed a principal of schools recently at \$2,000 per year with a promised increase to \$2,500 in

DYNAMITE EXPLOSION SHOOK VILLAGE

Quebec, July 2—At two a. m. Saturday a terrific dynamite explosion shook the entire village of St. Joseph Beauce. A number of houses were damaged but no bodily harm was done. The explosion occurred close to the house of the notary Valere Gosselin registrar for Beauce County. In this house alone were twelve persons, some of them week-end visitors from Quebec city. The houses of notary Gosselin and notary Edward Taschoeau were badly damaged, barely one pane of glass standing the shock of the explosion. A pile of fire wood was shot up in the air by the force of the shock and fence posts were picked up over two hundred feet away.

Ald. Cooper wanted to know where any better trustees could be secured than those whose terms were expired.

Mayor Hanson said the aldermen should consider the matter and submit names.

City Hall Heating.
Ald. Cooper asked for power on behalf of the City Hall committee to call for tenders for a new heating plant for the City Hall.

Ald. Shea said that estimates of a preceding chairman had shown the cost to be about \$5,000 or \$6,000.

Mayor Hanson took strong objection to the expenditure on the ground that no provision had been made for it.

After discussion the City Hall committee was instructed to call for tenders.

Isolation Hospital.

There was similar discussion concerning the Isolation Hospital, and the committee with Ald. Walker as chairman was continued. The site suggested is on the Municipal Home lot, York street, near the FitzRandolph line.

The Bathing Beach.

Ald. Shea reported that the special committee had selected the bathing beach used last summer and had decided to recommend that two bathing houses, 10 by 7 feet, be erected, one for men, one for women. Prices asked for them had ranged from \$110 each to \$185 for the two.

Ald. Davidson opposed any expenditure along this line, classing it as a luxury.

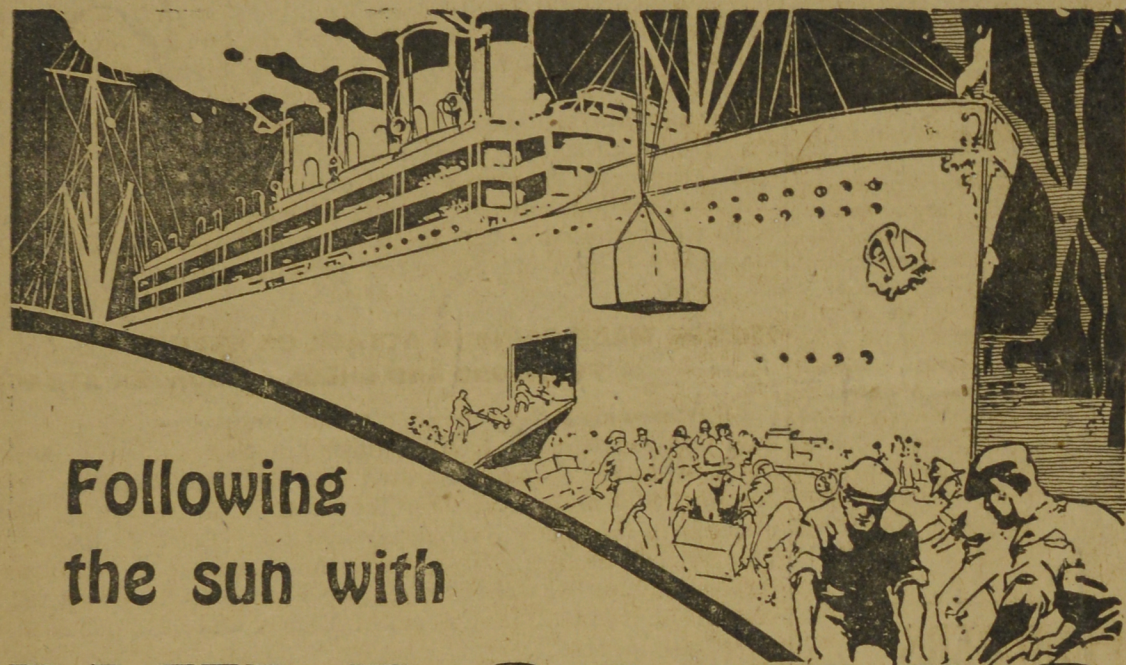
Ald. Burpee disagreed. Bathing was not a luxury, but a necessity, and should be encouraged.

The committee was instructed to act.

Agreement With Devon.

The much-vexed question of taxation of non-residents was discussed, and the following basis of agreement as reached by the financial committees of Fredericton and Devon was passed in committee. It is as follows:

1. The income shall be assessed once only and in that city or town in which the income is earned.
2. Such income shall be exempt by either the said city and the said town to the extent of \$300.
3. Any excess of income above \$300 shall be assessed at the current rate of assessment of such city or such town in which such income is earned.
4. The ratepayer so assessed shall be assessed in the city or town in which he is earning income at the time when the assessment is ordered in such city or town.
5. Poll tax, however, shall be paid by all such ratepayers in the city or town in which they reside.
