PARIS WARMLY WELCOMES PRESIDENT OF THE U. S.

Two Million People Made Up the Throng Which Greeted Head of the U. S. Government --- Route of Procession Lined for Miles With Captured German Guns and Other Battle Trophies

Paris, Dec. 14—President Wilson entered Paris today amid the boom of a hundred guns in salute and a greeting at the railway station and along the route to his temporary residence by enthusiastic throngs estimated to aggregate nearly two million persons whose cheers set the air vibrating.

President Poincare, Premier Clemenceau and other French officials met the presidential party at the railway station, together with French and American military officers and prominent citizens, while the republican guard band called out in his honor, greeted him with the strains of the "Star-Spangled Banner."

After the presentations and other formalities of welcome had been concluded the president with Mrs. Wilson and other members of the party entered open carriages of state and drove under overcast skies along the appointed route, escorted by the mounted Republican Guards between solid ranks of French troops.

The route was lined for miles with captured guns and other battle trophies and every available space was crowded by vast crowds waving and shouting their welcome.

Greeted in English

President Poincare greeted President Wilson as the latter stepped from the train, the French executive firmly grasping him by the hand. William Martin, who is attached to the foreign office, as introducer of ambassadors, presented Premier Clemenceau, who welcomed President Wilson in English saying he was extremely glad to meet him.

The formalities of the greeting over, the president entered a carriage with President Poincare.

Mrs. Wilson, with Miss Margaret Wilson, daughter of the president, followed in another carriage, accompanied by Madame Poincare. The party drove immediately to the residence of Prince Murat in the Rue de Monceau where the president will reside while in the French capital.

The route to the presidential residence was lined with French troops in solid array along its length. The welcome given by the crowds as the president drove by was vociferous and hearty.

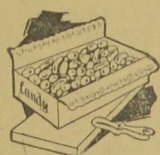
At a luncheon given by President and Mrs. Poincare, in honor of President and Mrs. Wilson, Mr. Wilson in reply to an address by the French president said it was delightful to him to find himself in France and to feel the quick contact of sympathy and unaffected friendship between the representatives of the United States and the representatives of France.

Eternal Principles of Right

"From the first thought of the people of the United States," said President Wilson, "turned toward something more than the mere winning of this war. It turned to the establishment of eternal principles of right and justice. It realized that merely to win the war was not enough; that it must be won in such a way and the questions raised by it settled in such a way as to insure the future peace of the world and lay the foundation for the freedom and happiness of its many peoples and nations.

"Never before has war worn so terrible a visage or exhibited more grossly the debasing influence of illicit ambitions. I am sure that I shall look
