## EVEN BAGDAD HAS MOVIES

Bagdad has one public motion picture theatre. The building is about 100 feet long by 60 feet wide, a somewhat primitive structure, but with the advantage that the ventilation is very good. The seats are divided into two classes. The price of first class tickets is 26 cents, and that of the second class admission 17 cents. The hall is furnished with electric lights and electric fans, power for which is supplied by a small motor.

The films shown are similar to those ordinarily shown in America. There is usually one long film featuring some prominent French or English actor, followed by a short comedy. Numerous American films are also shown.

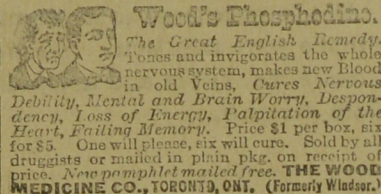

In some cities and towns in Canada it has been lamented that boys returning from overseas were not accorded any recognition in the way of a municipal reception, and complain has been made both by the townspeople and the boys themselves that no notification was given in advance of their arrival. Arriving at the unit headquarters those men who do not require further medical treatment and who may be safely allowed to go home for a two weeks' leave without fear of retarding their recovery, are given their pay and transportation to their homes.

He might stay over several trains or several days before going to his home in Welland.

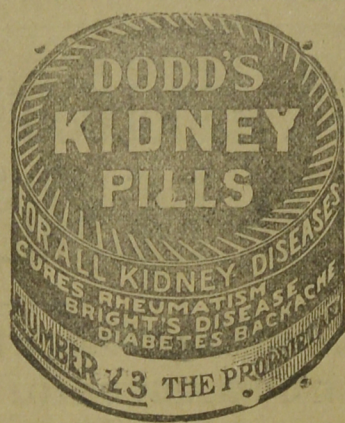

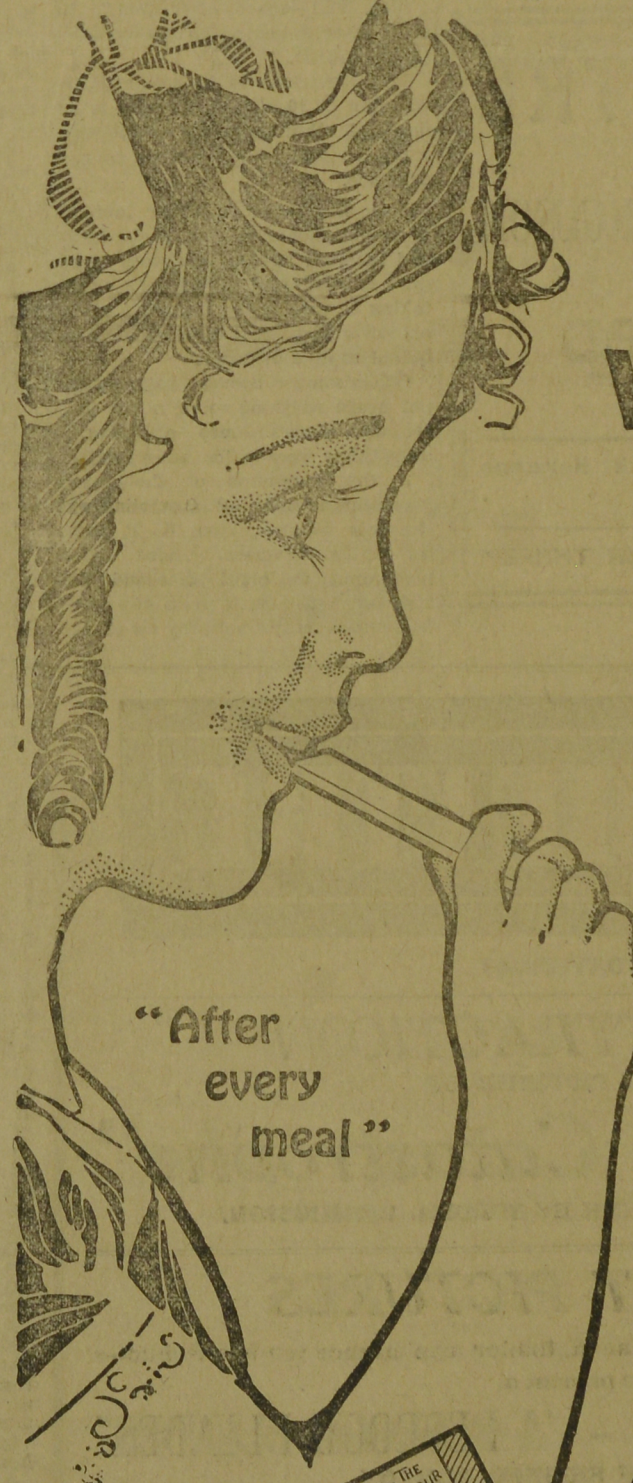
