and get results**U. S. WAR ORDERS KEEP
CHICAGO FACTORIES BUSY****Contracts Held in the State of Illinois Aggregate More Than Two Billion Dollars
--- Upwards of Thirty Thousand Men and Boys Are Kept on the Job---Unprecedented Wages Are Being Paid**

Chicago, Sept. 20.—The whistle of a freight train shrieked, switches were thrown and the long string of cars pulled out of South Chicago at dusk laden with war materials destined for the battlefields of France. It was one of many such trains that crawl out of Chicago and vicinity every week with a part of the \$1,000,000,000 of war orders placed by the army ordnance department alone.

There are still other contracts with the navy and the aircraft departments that help to keep scores of big and small steel factories, iron works, factories, stores and shops running day and night.

War contracts in the state of Illinois alone are estimated at more than \$2,000,000,000, according to the Illinois Manufacturers' Association, and additional contracts are being placed daily.

Shell casings, gun parts, steel for shells, steel plates for ships, gun carriages, gas engines, wagons, airplane parts, brass shells, blasting caps, electrical equipment, field desks for use in France shoes and clothing are some of the articles being turned out in greater quantities than ever before in the history of the Central West.

The concerns so engaged each employ from 300 to 30,000 men, women and boys, and most of them are making strong efforts to extend their facilities and increase the output.

In the meantime work is being rushed on the new factory of the Symington Corporation, which will begin

operations in about sixty days and will be able to turn out, among other commodities, some eleven thousand 155-millimeter shells a day. It is expected to be one of the largest shell-producing concerns in the country.

Practically all of the larger firms are devoting all their facilities to government contracts.

Unprecedented wages are being paid to skilled and unskilled labor in many of the war industries and men with years of experience in various painstaking tasks are demanding the salaries of prima donnas.

Former office boys, messengers and grocery boys have leaped from \$8 to \$25 a week and those displaying alertness and capability in the big war plants have been paid as much as \$40 a week. For common labor the average wage is 55 cents an hour in many of the factories. Phenomenal wages have been made by some employees doing piece work. A sheet roller employed by one of the largest steel companies here made \$800 last month while other sheet rollers cash monthly checks of from \$200 to \$500.

Spellers, men who relieve workers in various lines, are receiving from \$7 to \$9 a day. A coal miner who recently obtained a job in one of the steel plants now is capable of machining from 110 to 115 shells a day at 10 cents each. Most concerns are paying double time for overtime.

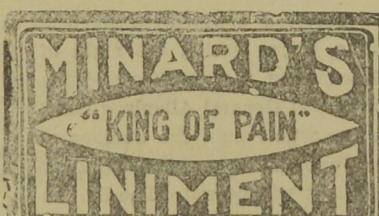
