

FRILLS AND FURBELOWS.

The Dolly Varden Order Again Coming Into Fashion - Clothes Worn When Grandmother was a Girl.

After several seasons when outdooring clothes have been worn from sunrise to sunset, it is a relief to find that we may again indulge in frills and furbelows, in flounces and in the truly feminine frocks in the afternoon and during the evening.

Many of these truly girly frocks are on the Dolly Varden order, reflecting the quaint conceits of the 1830 period. It is with real enthusiasm that the women have taken up the frocks of pale blue and pink, mauve and yellow organdie, made with flounces and frilling, fichus and big sashes. Just the frocks that call for old-timey cameo brooches, lockets and pracelets, and even the sash pins.

And if you would add the touch that is going to link you with the picture of your grandmother when she was a girl, you will wear the locket probably of enamel to match in coloring your frock, suspended on a narrow black velvet ribbon. If you thought it rather spoiled the effect of the lovely cameo brooch, then tie the black velvet ribbon around your wrist and let the locket dangle from it.

POTATO BISCUIT.

Two cups sifted flour, one teaspoon salt, three teaspoons baking powder, three tablespoons shortening, one cup mashed potato, liquid sufficient to mix. Sift together twice the flour, salt and baking powder. Cut or rub into this the cold shortening. In the same way rub into this flour mixture the mashed potatoes. Finally, add just enough cold liquid to make the mass cling together. Do not knead. Place on a floured board, roll until one-half inch thick, and cut into rounds. Place these in lightly floured biscuit tins and bake fifteen to twenty minutes in a moderately hot oven. Bake all potato breads more slowly than those made with flour alone

IRONING DAY HINT.

If your flatirons seem rough and dirty, pour some fine salt out on a cloth or paper and rub the irons over it. If your flatirons have rusted, rub them over with a cloth wet in kerosene oil.
